In my capacity as Continuum of Care Lead for the Las Vegas/Clark County CoC and collaborative applicant staff, I am documenting the reduction of funding being requested in our FY2016 compared to our last Grant Inventory Worksheet that was submitted on July 21, 2016. Women's Development Center (WDC) was a recipient from the FY2015 CoC Competition of a \$128,474 renewal project named, "Transitional Housing Program" with grant number NV0031L9T001507.

Clark County Social Service received notification on August 8, 2016, from our local HUD Representative Marilee Hansen that WDC leadership communicated they were discontinuing this project and not accepting the FY2015 grant agreement, therefore reducing our annual renewal demand by that grant amount. Subsequent attempts by me to communicate with WDC regarding this decision or alternative plans of action to attempt to retain the CoC project in our community have been unsuccessful.

Attached to this memo is a notification letter sent from WDC addressed to Maria Cremer dated August 9, 2016, which was stamped received by the Office of Community Planning and Development on August 16, 2016. I received a copy of this letter via email on August 22, 2016.
