

Coordinated by Community Solutions, the 100,000 Homes Campaign is a national movement of more than 200 communities working together to find and house 100,000 of their most vulnerable, chronically homeless neighbors by July 31, 2014. Participating communities announced on June 11, 2014 that they had reached their goal and had found permanent housing for more than 100,000 people, including more than 30,000 veterans, at an estimated cost savings to taxpayers of \$1.3 billion. The Campaign is led by former Army Captain Becky Kanis of Community Solutions.

Goal:

Help communities find permanent housing for 100,000 medically vulnerable and chronically homeless Americans in four years without significant new tax money.

Who Participated Nationally?

- More than 230 communities have joined the Campaign
- 107 communities have done registry weeks to survey their homeless neighbors in the early hours of the morning and build a by-name file on each one
- 43 communities have attended intensive Housing Placement Improvement Boot Camps, in partnership with the Rapid Results Institute. On average, these communities have doubled the number of people they are moving into permanent housing each month. Several have tripled this number.

Who Got Housed Nationally?

- Over 100,000 people have been housed by participating communities, including 30,071 veterans.
- These numbers reflect people who were chronically homeless or medically vulnerable or both at the time of housing.
- Over 65,000 homeless people have been surveyed on the streets or in shelters by local teams and volunteers to help communities know everyone experiencing homelessness by name.

Southern Nevada's Involvement

- May 2011: Southern Nevada signed on as a partner community
- September 2011: 100K Homes team conducted HUD-VASH Boot Camp
 - Reduced the number of days to house a veteran from 120 days to 35 days.
- May 2012: Rapid Results Boot Camp in San Diego
 - 18 local representatives attended
 - Housed 84 veterans in 100 days
 - Welcome Home baskets provided for 50 of these veterans
- June 2012: Registry Week
 - Registered 326 vulnerable and chronically homeless including veterans
- November 2012: Recognized for providing the 23,000th home
- March 2013: Rapid Results Acceleration Boot Camp in Los Angeles
 - 14 local representatives attended
 - Housed 116 chronically homeless in 100 days
- May 2013 Local Mini-Boot Camp with 33 community partners in attendance
- **May 2011-May 2014: Housed 1194 chronically homeless Veterans and Non-Veterans**
