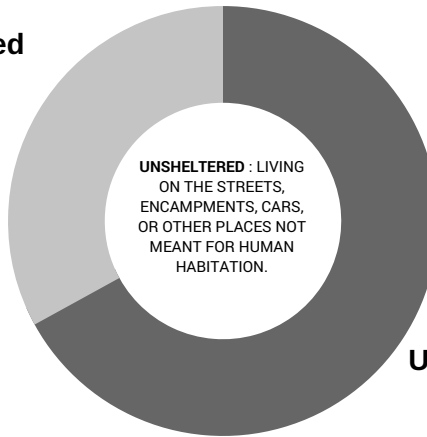

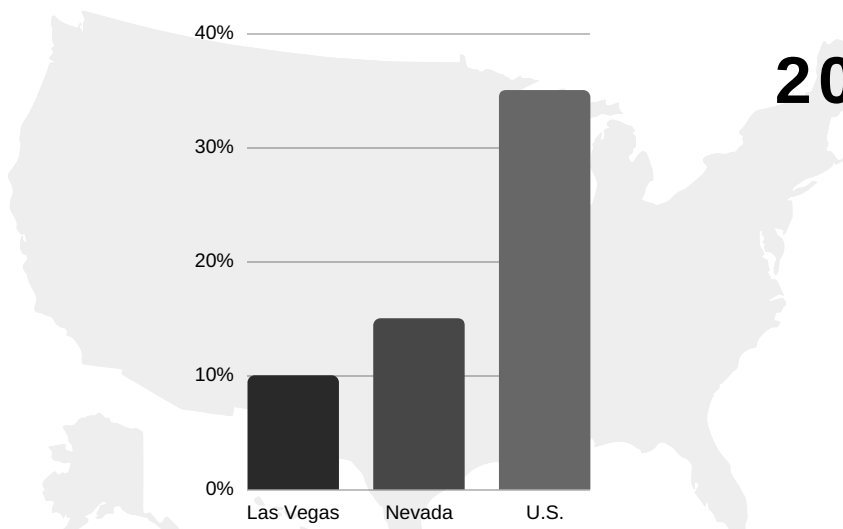

Nevada has the worst shortage of affordable and available rental homes in the nation. For every 100 homes needed, only 15 are available Statewide. The shortage is even greater in Las Vegas with only 10 available units for every 100 affordable homes needed. The National average is 35.
