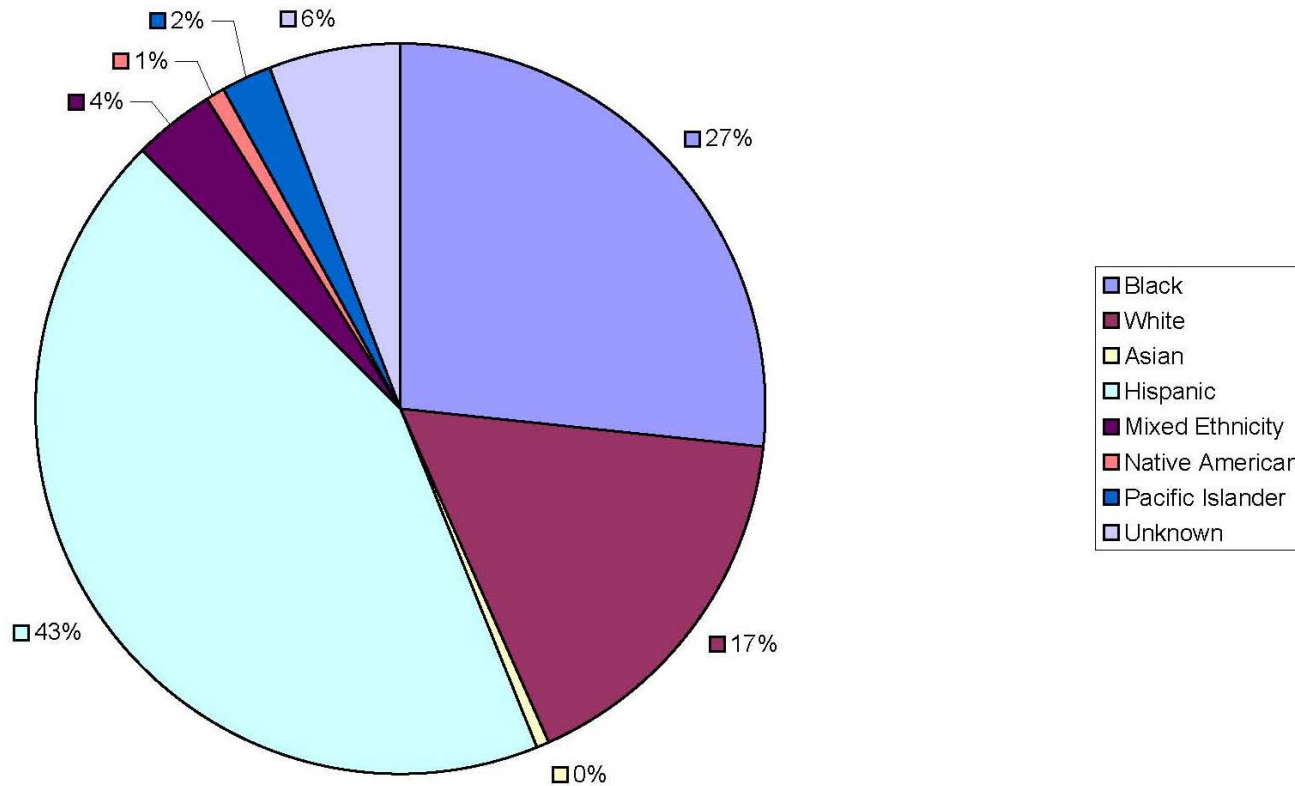
FAMILY CONNECT RECAP

- Over 225 families served
 - 266 children in attendance
- Approximately 60 participating agencies and departments
- Approximately 20 community volunteers

Client Demographics

- 16.07 of adult clients reported a disability
- 5.36% of adult clients were veterans
- 47.77% of clients brought children:
- 29.46% reported homelessness or imminent risk of homelessness
- 22.77% of adult clients were male
- 70.54% of adult clients were female
- 5.69% of adult clients were unknown gender

Outcomes



Medical Services:

- **Nevada Health Centers saw 26 clients for clinic referrals and information**
- **Southern Nevada Health district:**
 - 36 received info on and 12 clients signed up for teen pregnancy prevention classes
 - 9 signed up for adult workshops
- **Future smiles connected with 77 clients for children's dental treatment**
- **United Way connected with 82 clients for medical programming**
- **Huntridge Teen Clinic connected with 48 clients regarding medical services**
 - 14 dental appointments were made
 - 16 referrals to medical clinic
 - 4 referrals for abstinence and birth control program
- **14 clients connected to home healthcare through home healthcare specialists**



Financial Planning:

Financial Guidance Center:

- **14 clients received information on financial counseling and literacy**
- **25 clients received information on housing programs**

Transformation Concepts provided information to 10 clients

Legal Guidance:

- **Disability Action Advocates saw 10 clients for disability claims and eligibility**
- **Nevada Legal Services: 28 clients for low-income legal support and referral**
- **LACSN provided 32 referrals and saw clients for bankruptcy, family law, special education, guardianship information, and more**
- **DA family Support assisted 8 families with case status updates, 4 families with child support enforcement and modification, and opened 4 new cases**



Behavioral/Mental Health:

- **Multiple Behavioral and Mental Health Agencies provided information on PSR/BST and Day Treatment, adult outpatient, child outpatient, clinical, and therapy**
- **Westcare provided 39 service referrals**
- **7 clients signed up for therapy through Rainbow Community Services**
- **Mojave Mental Health**
 - **Assisted 3 clients with medication management for children**
 - **Connected one adult client and 5 children with outpatient therapy**
 - **Opened cases for one adult client and 2 child clients for case management**
- **SNAMHS saw 46 clients and provided 13 clinic referrals**
- **Southern Nevada Children first made two clinical appointments**
- **Nevada Council on Problem Gambling saw 12 clients**



Job Readiness:

- **Workforce Connections connected with 25 clients regarding job services and programming**
- **Nevada Partners provided 33 clients information on job readiness**
Goodwill saw 71 clients for job services
 - **20 clients were invited to a Denny's hiring event**
 - **1 client signed up for job training**
- **DETR provided job info to 60 clients**
- **7 applications for employment were submitted through Home Healthcare Specialists**
- **Southern Nevada Children First enrolled 4 clients into their WIA program**
- **Southern Nevada Regional Housing Authority provided information to 13 clients on youth WIA and 26 clients for adult WIA programming**
- **HELP of Southern Nevada signed up 6 clients for job readiness workshops**



Housing and Foreclosure Assistance:

- **Clients received information on emergency shelter, transitional housing and permanent housing programs through: HELP of Southern Nevada, Shade Tree, Westcare, Family promise, Nevada community Associates, New Genesis, and the Southern Nevada Regional Housing Authority**
- **Neighborhood Housing Services of Southern Nevada:**
- **connected 8 people with affordable housing info**
- **4 people with homebuyer education classes**
- **Women's Development Center:**
- **Provided 10 clients information on affordable rentals**
- **Provided 6 Clients information on housing stability programs**
- **Silver State Fair Housing Council provided information about fair housing laws, reasonable accommodations, reasonable modifications, and housing discrimination**



Childcare/Summer Programming/Teen Resources:

- **Boys and Girls Club provided information on summer programming and general programming to 30 families**
- **Las Vegas Urban League saw 26 families for child care subsidies, and 12 applications were submitted**
- **Teen and Young Adult services information was provided through Nevada Partnership for Homeless Youth, St. Jude's Ranch, HELP of Southern Nevada, Child Focus, and Westcare**



Food and General Resources:

- **Food pantry information was provided through ThreeSquare, Salvation Army Family Services, Lutheran Social Services, United Methodist Social Ministries and Catholic Charities.**
- **5 families transported to food pantry and back for Salvation Army programming, and 7 families were provided with phone/pharmacy cards**
- **Department of Welfare connected with:**
 - 29 clients for SNAP benefits and provided applications
 - 9 clients for Medicaid
 - 3 Clients for TANF
- **Catholic Charities provided WIC information to 17 families**
- **HELP of Southern Nevada provided:**
 - 43 clients with Emergency Resources Services info
 - 7 clients with info on Baby First services
 - 26 clients with info on 211
 - Interviewed 2 clients for SNAP applications



Food and General Resources:

- **Department of family Services Parenting Project connected with 22 clients for parenting classes and program information**
- **Boys and Girls Clubs, Rainbow Community Services, and Olive Crest provided information for Family Resource Centers, and welfare services**
- **11 families received free phones through Unite Me Now**
- **Title One HOPE provided 75 families with information for low-income services and school district assistance**
- **Veteran services provided through Las Vegas Urban League, US Vets, Yours Truly Ministries and Vet Center**
- **Aging & Disability Services Division connected with 18 clients for Medicaid low-income subsidy, 28 clients for chronic disease self management workshops, and 9 clients for dementia and Alzheimer's services**
- **Nevada Talking Book Services provided information to 23 clients**

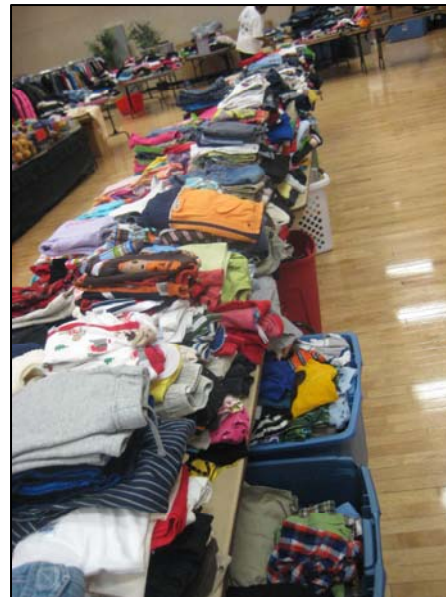
