LAS VEGAS/CLARK COUNTY

APPROVED TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE

1. Standardize performance outcomes and require funding applicants to reach these outcomes in order to receive funding through the Evaluation Working Group
2. Develop and implement monitoring tools to ensure grantees meet performance outcomes and comply with HUD rules, grant obligations, and CoC policies
3. Use data to inform policy
4. Map the current system; analyze gaps in how clients move through the current system.

UPDATE ON PERFORMANCE MEASURE

- Initial measures set and integrated into NOFA scoring tools
- Plan created to address data issues (coverage, quality, depth)
- Community-wide measures generated out of Clarity

NEXT STEPS

- Evaluation Working Group using new “PM focused” scoring tools
- HomeBase to create draft monitoring tools during NOFA blackout
- Data action plan implementation continues (esp with emergency shelters)



WHAT DO WE MEAN BY SYSTEMS MAPPING?

- HEARTH CoC Interim regs require a centralized or coordinated assessment system for CoC and ESG grantees
- Defined as “a process designed to coordinate client intake, assessment, and provision of referrals”
- Essentially connects a client with the “right” intervention independent of where the client accesses our system
- Maximizes system resources (high-need clients receive intensive intervention; low-need clients receive a “light touch”)
- Mapping the current system allows us to identify potential gateways, barriers that we need to reduce, system gaps, and existing resources



UPDATE ON SYSTEM MAPPING

- HUD TA does not cover full Coordinated Assessment design and implementation– just initial steps (establishing a framework)
- CoC briefed on concepts of Coordinated Assessment
- Emergency shelters introduced to systems-redesign

NEXT STEPS

- HomeBase to survey the CoC during the blackout
- Early 2013, begin mapping the system and establish guiding principles for coordinated assessment



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
