PROJECT HOMELESS CONNECT RECAP

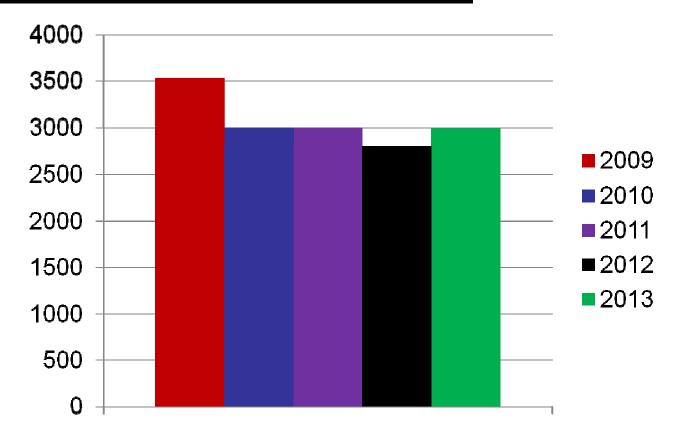
- Approximately 2,992 clients served:
 - 300 families
- Over 130 participating agencies and departments
- Appr. 520 community volunteers
- Over 400 agency volunteers







Client Counts 2009-2013









PREREGISTRATION

- 1,270 Clients Pre-registered and assigned Clarity Passports
- 485 entered in separate entrance
- Clarity Passport allowed for average check-in time of 39 seconds per person
- Special thanks to Catholic Charities for assistance with implementation of Clarity Passport distribution and usage at event







HOUSING/SHELTER

- Included 20 organizations and served 417 clients
- 78 clients were placed into transitional/permanent housing programs
- 98 clients were pending placements, for verifications
- 110 clients were prescreened for housing
- 78 clients obtained information on rental and utility assistance
- 39 clients obtained information security deposit assistance and rapid re-housing programs
- 260 clients were given referrals for housing programs and assistance
- 30 clients received emergency shelter
- 64 clients received information on fair housing laws through Silver State Fair Housing Council







COMMUNITY RESOURCES/ SOCIAL SERVICES

- Included 33 agencies serving 888 clients
- 24 SNAP applications were completed through ThreeSquare and HELP of Southern Nevada
- Department of Welfare and Supportive Services connected with 70 clients for case inquires and SNAP applications
- Clark County Social Service provided:
 - 85 clients with Financial Assistance
 - 38 clients with Medical Assistance
 - 17 clients with transportation out of state
 - 70 additional appointments
- 72 Client were assisted with birth certificates and IDs







COMMUNITY RESOURCES, CONTINUED

- 2,500 Nevada 211 flyers distributed, 86 referrals on-site
- City of Las Vegas provided 7 Greyhound tickets home
- Mobile Power Solutions issued 203 free phones and allowed for 8 phone called home
- United Way connected with 39 clients for IRS assistance and tax prep
- Clients were able to obtain information on Affordable Care Act, food resources, HIV resources, rental and utility assistance, transportation, free Bibles, turkey vouchers for Thanksgiving, and more

FAMILIES WITH CHILDREN

- Included 9 agencies serving 239 families
- Clients received information on WIC, Title One HOPE services, DA Family Support and more
- 3 appts were made for Baby First Services through HELP of So. NV
- 12 applications were submitted for low-income childcare

TEENS & YOUNG ADULTS

- Included 7 agencies serving 129 clients
- 6 clients received job assistance through Las Vegas Urban League
- 5 clients were placed into transitional/permanent housing
- 69 clients were given service referrals for additional services

















SENIOR SERVICES

- Served 143 clients
- Provided Medicare and Social Security assistance, food pantry information, medical resources, and rental and utility resources
- 10 MIPPA "Medicaid extra help" applications were submitted
- Emergency services provided to 8 seniors through Jewish Family Services
- Social Security Administration:
 - 100 clients filed for post entitlement changes
 - 11 follow-up appointments made







VETERANS

- Included 11 agencies serving 121 clients
- Services included: DD214 retrieval, housing, benefits assistance, counseling services, suicide prevention, job services, home and student loan information
- 8 veterans placed into TH/PH
- 2 veterans placed into emergency shelter
- 37 clients assisted with benefits claims through the VA
- 15 clients were able to check benefits status and medical records through the VA
- 100 \$25 Walmart gift cards distributed
- Over 60 clients were placed in jobs through Vons
- 25 clients received information on services from VA Suicide Prevention

BEHAVIORAL HEALTH

- Included 22 agencies serving 400 clients
- Services included:
 - Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services,
 - Informational handouts and Resource Directories
 - 12-Step Recovery and smoking cessation
 - Case Management Consultation and referral Services
- Outcomes:
 - 14 Clients referred for detox through Westcare
 - 36 Clients sought services for methadone treatment
 - Clients were able to sign up for mental health services, covered under the Medicaid expansion







JOB READINESS

- Included 7 booths and served 199 clients
- 10 clients were placed into jobs and work experiences
- 41 clients enrolled in job training programs
- 28 clients were given employment referrals and information services
- 77 clients submitted job applications on-site for follow-up











MEDICAL, DENTAL, and VISION

- Included services from Nevada Health Centers, First Med, Southern Nevada Health District, Beacon of Hope Hospice, E-Study Sites, Summerlin Lions Club, First Person Careline
- Approximately 1,077 medical referrals were given
- 469 clients received vision services by the Summerlin Lions Club
- 220 clients received dental screenings
- 56 follow-up dental appointments were made
- SNHD administered 182 adult vaccines, 28 children's vaccines, and 42 flu shots
- E Study Site provided 126 referrals/information for skin treatments
- 22 clients signed up for diabetes screening and assistance
- First Person provided 62 doctor consultations



















COURTS SERVICES

- North Las Vegas Municipal served 196 clients
- LV Municipal Courts served 257 clients
 - 77 criminal
 - 273 traffic
- Results pending for:
 - North Las Vegas Justice Courts
 - Las Vegas Justice Courts









LEGAL RESOURCES

- Included 7 organizations and serviced 164 clients
- Services provided: general questions regarding family, criminal, and civil law,
- Dept of Corrections issued 21 letters of incarceration
- ACLU conducted 4 intakes
- DA Family Support outcomes:
 - 7 case modifications
 - 15 bench warrant quash dates set
 - 36 case specific questions addressed







PETS

- 89 pets served
 - 35 received wellness checks
- 89 Pet owners were provided with vouchers for free spay/neutering
 - 39 have received service at time of report
- Pet food and supplies provided

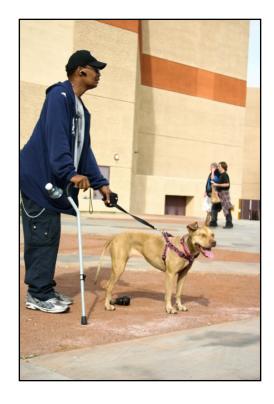
