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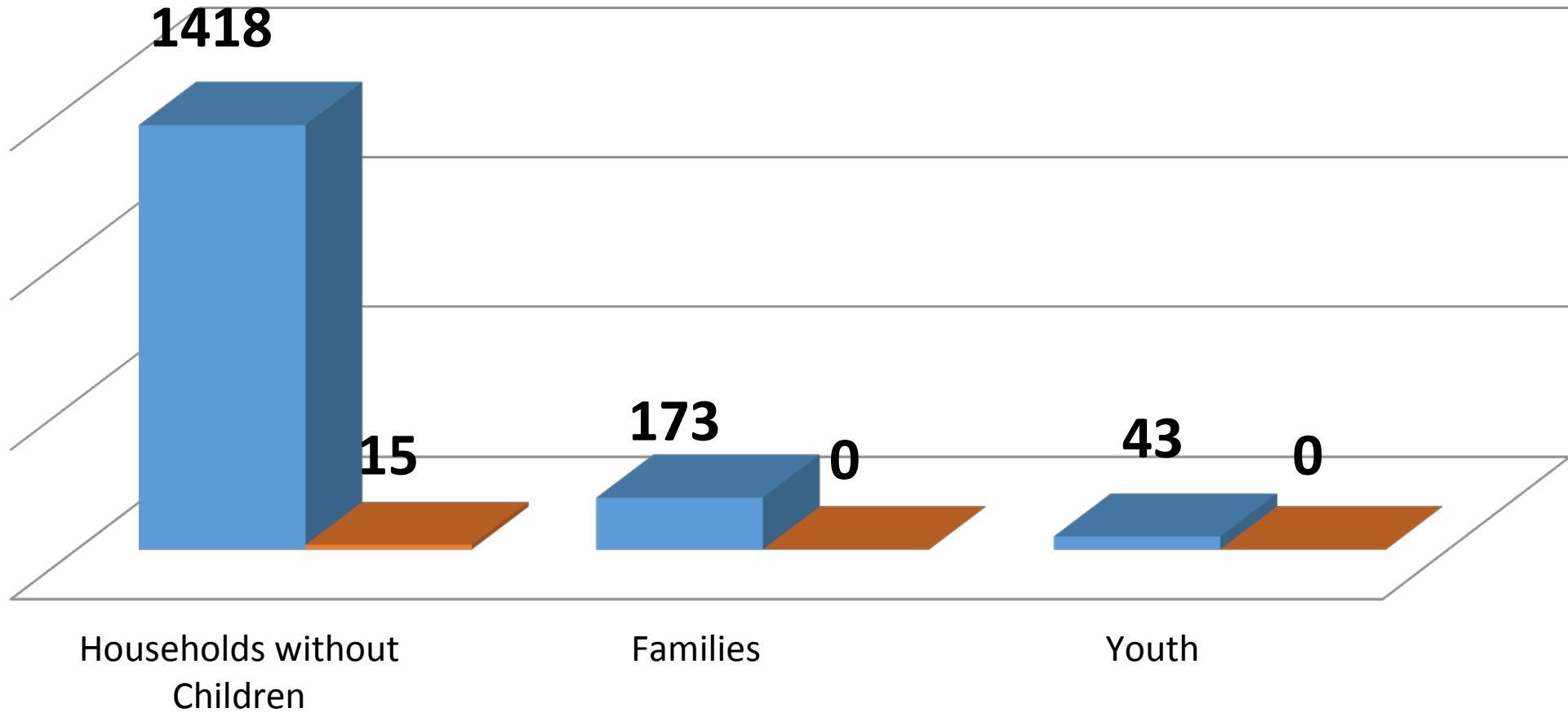
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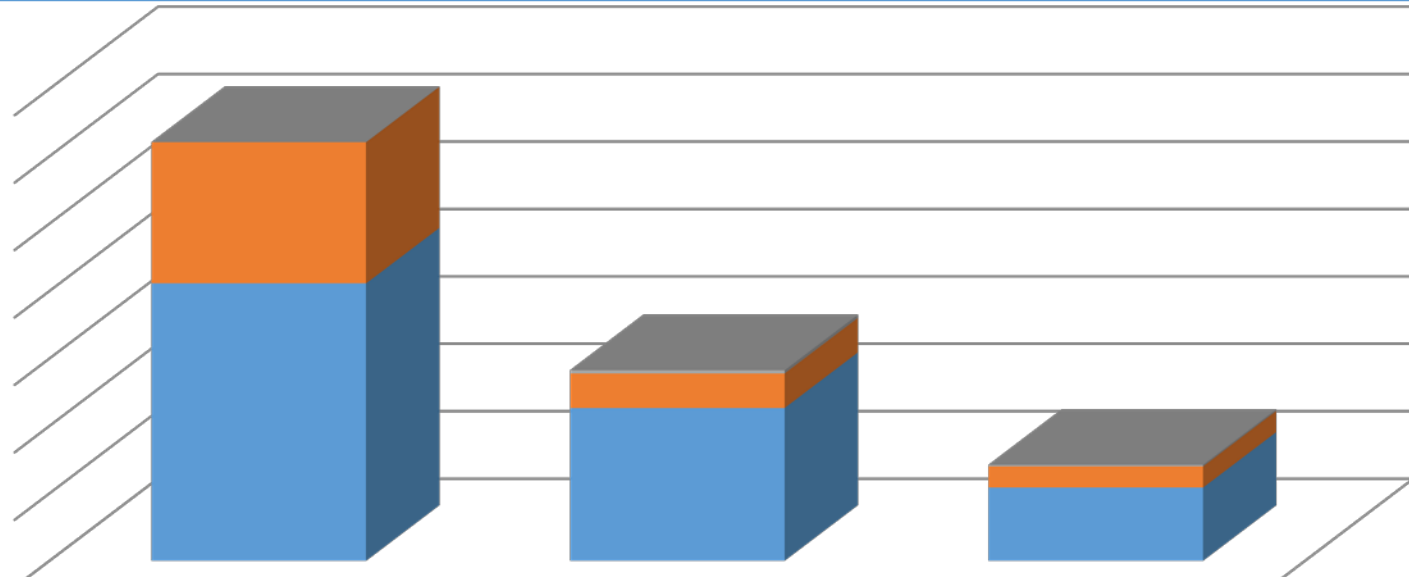
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Current Need: Households Waiting on the Community Queue vs. Housing Vacancies

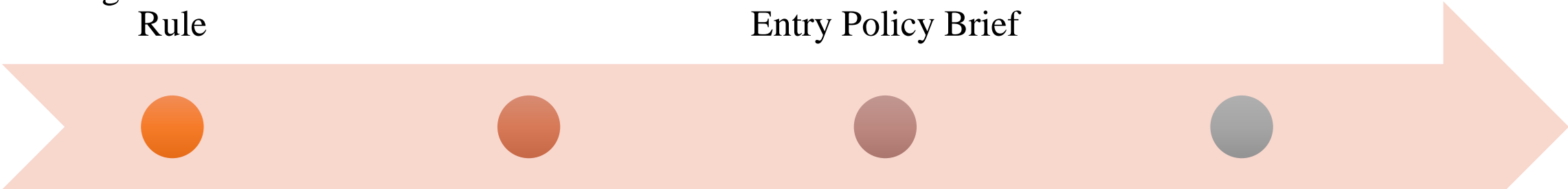

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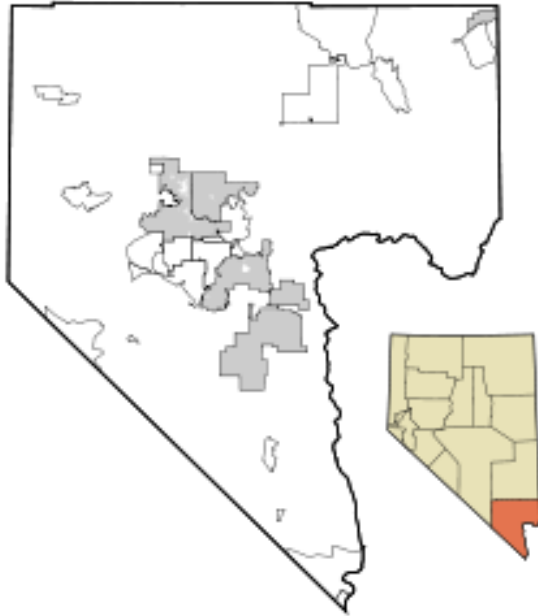
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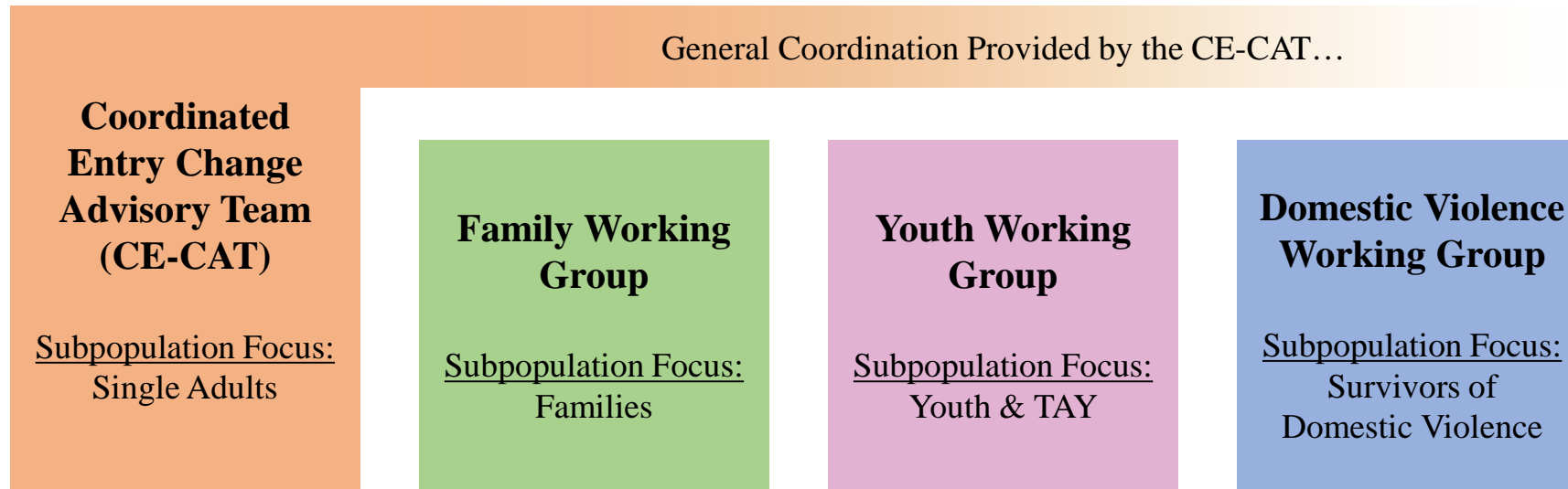

Southern Nevada Coordinated Entry



- Began piloting coordinated entry – starting with single adults – three years ago
- Began planning processes for families, youth, and survivors of domestic violence in late 2016/early 2017
- Launched coordinated entry for families, youth, and survivors of domestic violence in October 2017

Southern Nevada Coordinated Entry



- The **CE-CAT** oversaw the development of coordinated entry in the community, with a particular focus on the process for single adults and the associated assessment tool.
- **Subpopulation-specific working groups** focused on developing processes to serve their respective subpopulations, including designing coordinated entry processes and selecting assessment tools

Coordinated Entry Policies and Procedures

Why Develop Coordinated Entry Policies and Procedures?

- Provides a common understanding and set of expectations for the CoC and HUD-funded programs and agencies
- Development process provides opportunities for crucial community discussions and decisions
- Required by HUD – January 23, 2018 Deadline
 - Certain provisions are mandated by HUD
 - Most aspects of the Coordinated Entry system and process require community decisions.



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Coordinated Entry Policies and Procedures

Development Process



December 2016 - April 2017

- Subpopulation groups work to develop and plan implementation of subpopulation coordinated entry processes.
- HUD publishes Coordinated Entry Notice, setting compliance deadline of January 2018 and specifying requirements for Coordinated Entry Policies and Procedures.
- Community stakeholder groups discuss whether and how to coordinate with or incorporate subpopulation coordinated entry processes into single adult system.

Coordinated Entry Policies and Procedures

Development Process



May 2017

- HomeBase facilitates discussion at CE-CAT meeting to walk through key requirements for Coordinated Entry policies and procedures, community-specific topics to discuss, and remaining decision points.
- CE-CAT creates a work group to continue developing policies & procedures. Initial focus is Single Adult system.
- HomeBase prepares initial draft of policies and procedures.

Coordinated Entry Policies and Procedures

Development Process



June 2017 – December 2017

- Policies & Procedures work group meets regularly to continue drafting and refining the document, seeking information and feedback from subpopulation groups and other community stakeholders where needed.
- Focus of document shifts from Single Adult system to comprehensive Coordinated Entry System to reflect community decision to incorporate Single Adult and subpopulation processes.

Coordinated Entry Policies and Procedures

Development Process



December 2017

- Policies & Procedures work group presents draft to CE Working Group (formerly CE-CAT) for approval.
- CE Working Group presents Policies & Procedures to SNH CoC Board.

Coordinated Entry Policies and Procedures

Development Process



January 2018

- CE Working Group presents final Policies & Procedures to CoC and CoC Board for approval.
- Deadline for adoption is January 23, 2018, to meet compliance requirements set forth in HUD's January 2017 Coordinated Entry Notice.

Coordinated Entry Policies and Procedures

Reviewing the Document:
