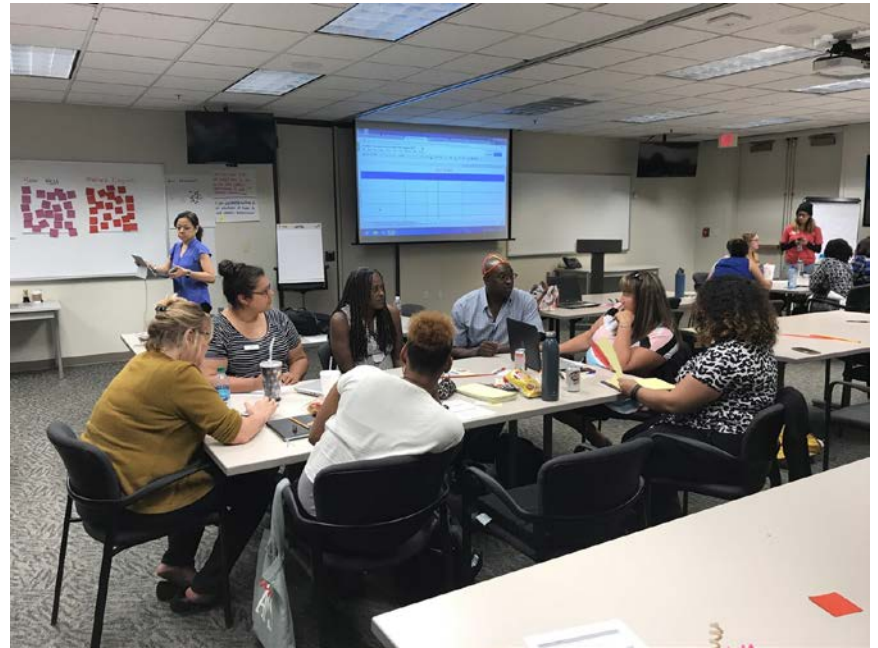

Action Cycle: Feb 2018-June 2018

AIM Statement:

The Southern Nevada Built for Zero team will reduce our BNL to 450 people by June 30th 2018 by increasing housing placements and reducing inflow.

Driver: Accelerate Housing Placements

Change Ideas/ Strategies:

- **Housing Fund Campaign**
- **Moving-On Strategy**
- **New! Bridge Housing Development**

Driver: Reduce Inflow

Change Ideas/ Strategies:

- **New! Create Diversion Pilot (Divert people from the queue and from chronic homelessness, using evidenced-based diversion strategies)**

Progress

Housing Campaign

- Developed a fundraising pitch
- Raised pledge for 10 Units so far
- Nevada Community Foundation came on as the Fiscal Agent for the fund
- New website with public dashboard being built. Expected Launch Date of March 15th.

Moving-On Strategy

Utilizing the [Moving On Toolkit](#) provided by CSH to help Southern Nevada establish a Moving On Initiative to help with transitioning clients from permanent supportive housing to suitable affordable housing options to free up permanent supportive housing options for more vulnerable community members more suitable for a greater intervention.

The workgroup has developed:

- **A work plan with actionable goals and deadlines to govern the process**
- **Two mini work sessions to flush complex challenges to include:**
 - o **Landlord screening checklist and criteria rubric for case managers to use to assess clients for moving on**
 - o **Assessment tool for case managers to use to assess for moving on readiness**
- **Preliminary data provided by Bitfocus to assess who within the system may be good candidates for moving on**

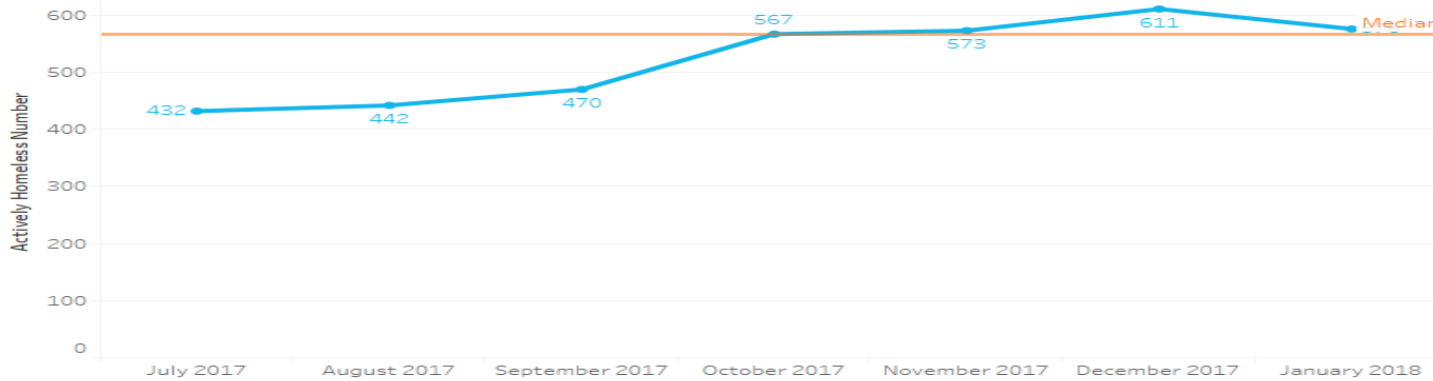

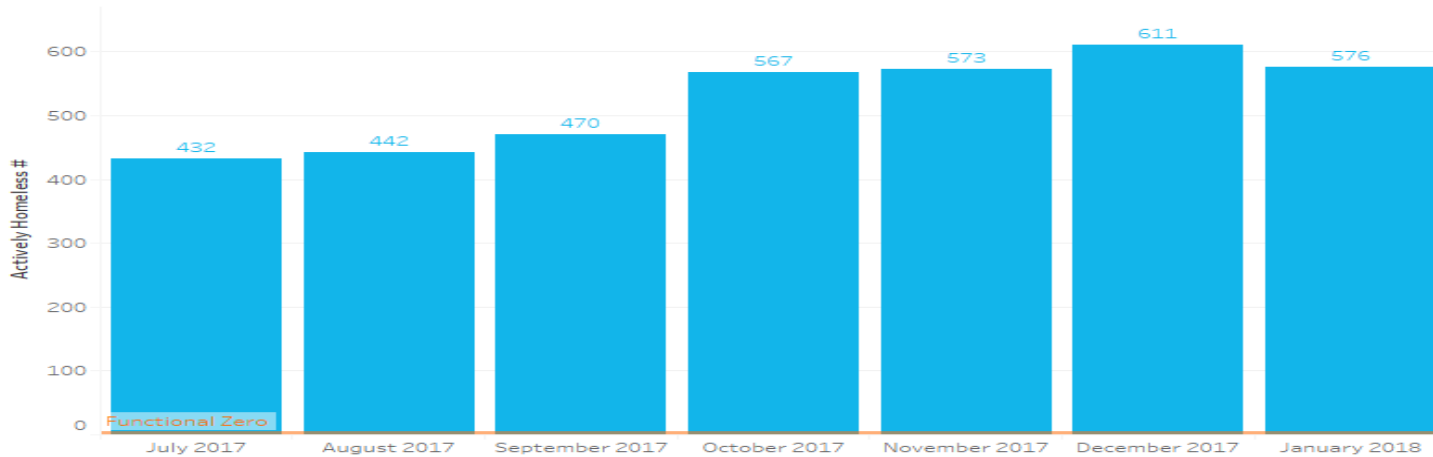

Action Cycle: Feb 2018-June 2018

AIM Statement:

We will REDUCE our by name list to 374 veterans by June 26, 2018.

Driver: Reduce Inflow

Change Ideas/ Strategies:

- Develop monthly aftercare program (check-in)
- Progressive outreach daily for diversion clients
- Track data on diversion clients
- Provide more robust case management while in RRH program

Driver: Accelerate Housing Placements

Change Ideas/ Strategies:

- HUD/ VASH case managers will work more closely with the outreach teams, GPD (Grant & Per Diem) & HCHV (Healthcare Care for Homeless Veterans) programs to ensure that Veterans are permanently housed within 90 days of assessment.

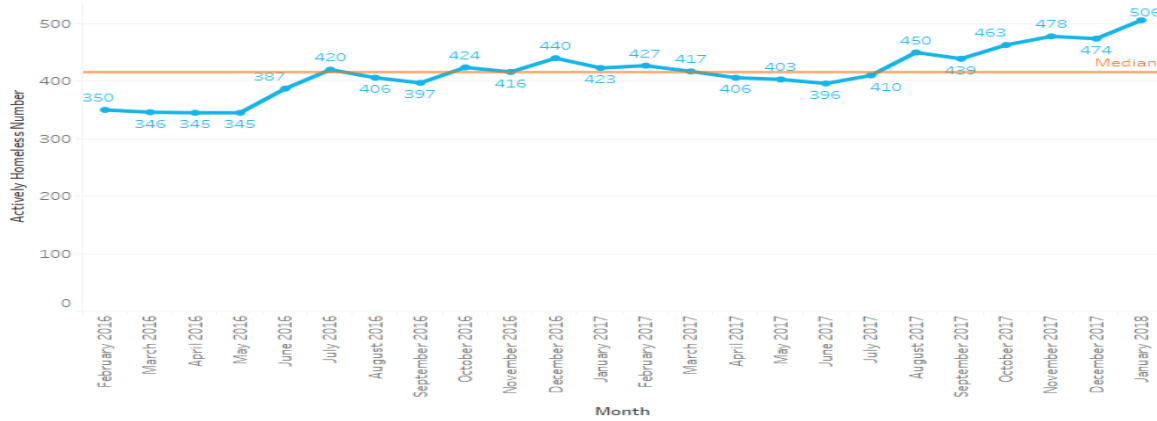

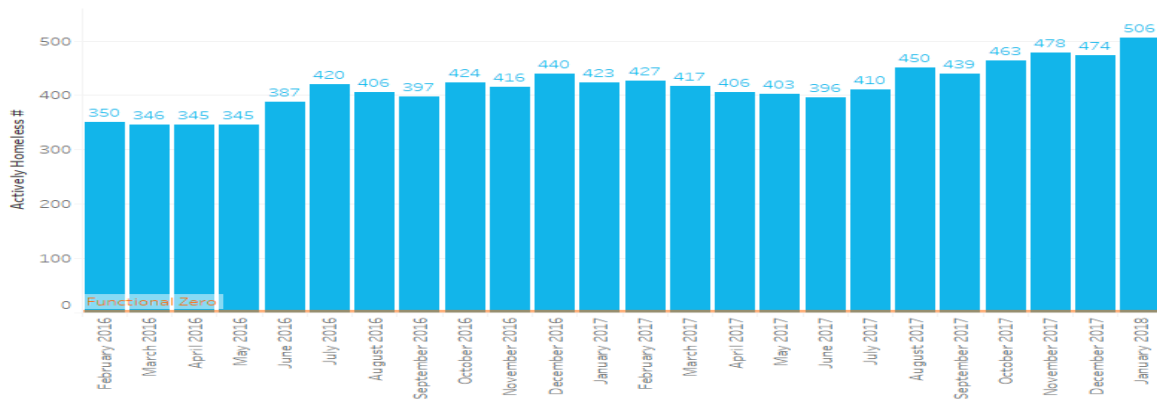
