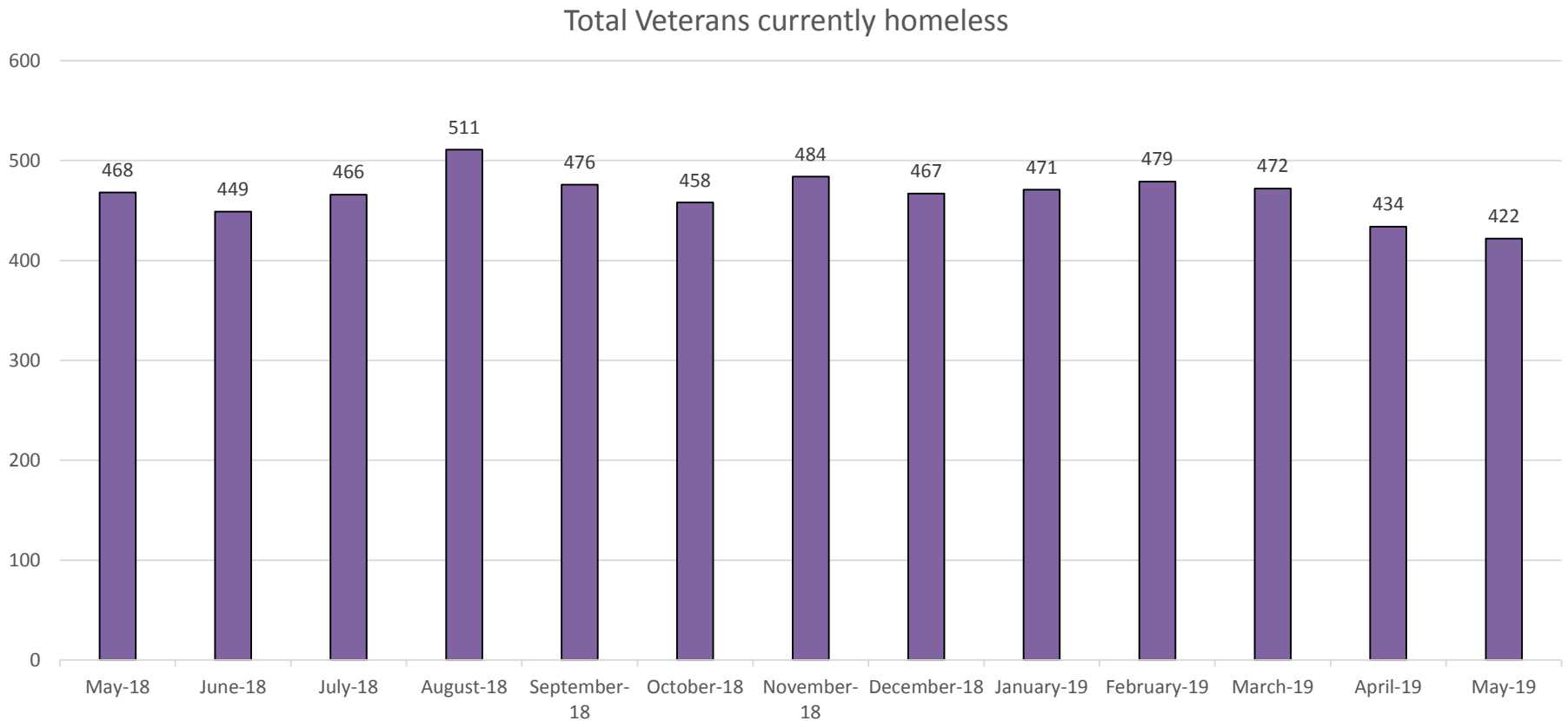
Veteran By-Name List

- Part A: Verified Veterans eligible for VA housing assistance. Veterans who are staying at community shelters (Catholic Charities, Rescue Mission, Shade Tree, Westcare and Salvation Army Shelter) or literally on the streets.
- Community shelter list is given to the VA monthly from Bitfocus.
- Part B: Verified Veterans currently staying in a VA Transitional Housing Program. (Grant and Per Diem (GPD) – U.S. Vets, HELP U.S.A., and Salvation Army) and (Health Care for Homeless Veterans (HCHV) – Salvation Army contract beds and Westcare).

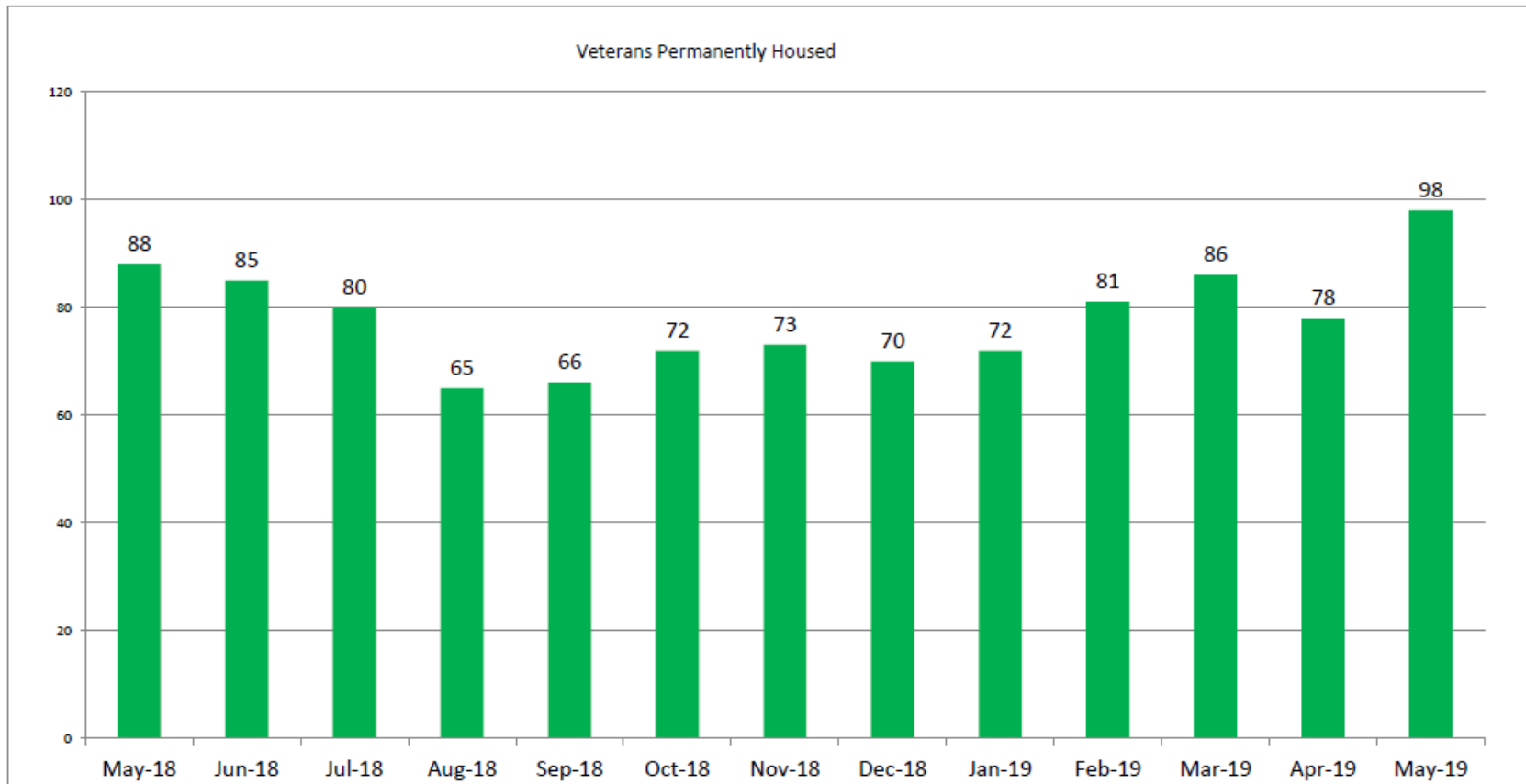
Active Veteran Homeless Population – May 2019

- **Total Homeless Veterans = 422 Veterans**
 - Unsheltered: 51 Veterans
 - Sheltered: 371 Veterans
 - In emergency shelter: 37 Veterans
 - In Grant and Per Diem: 276 Veterans
 - In VA contract beds: 58 Veterans
- **Active Non-Eligible Veterans:** From March 2019 through May 2019 National Guard/Reserve with no activation and Dishonorable Discharge: 24
- **Total Homeless Veterans including active non-eligible = 446 Veterans**

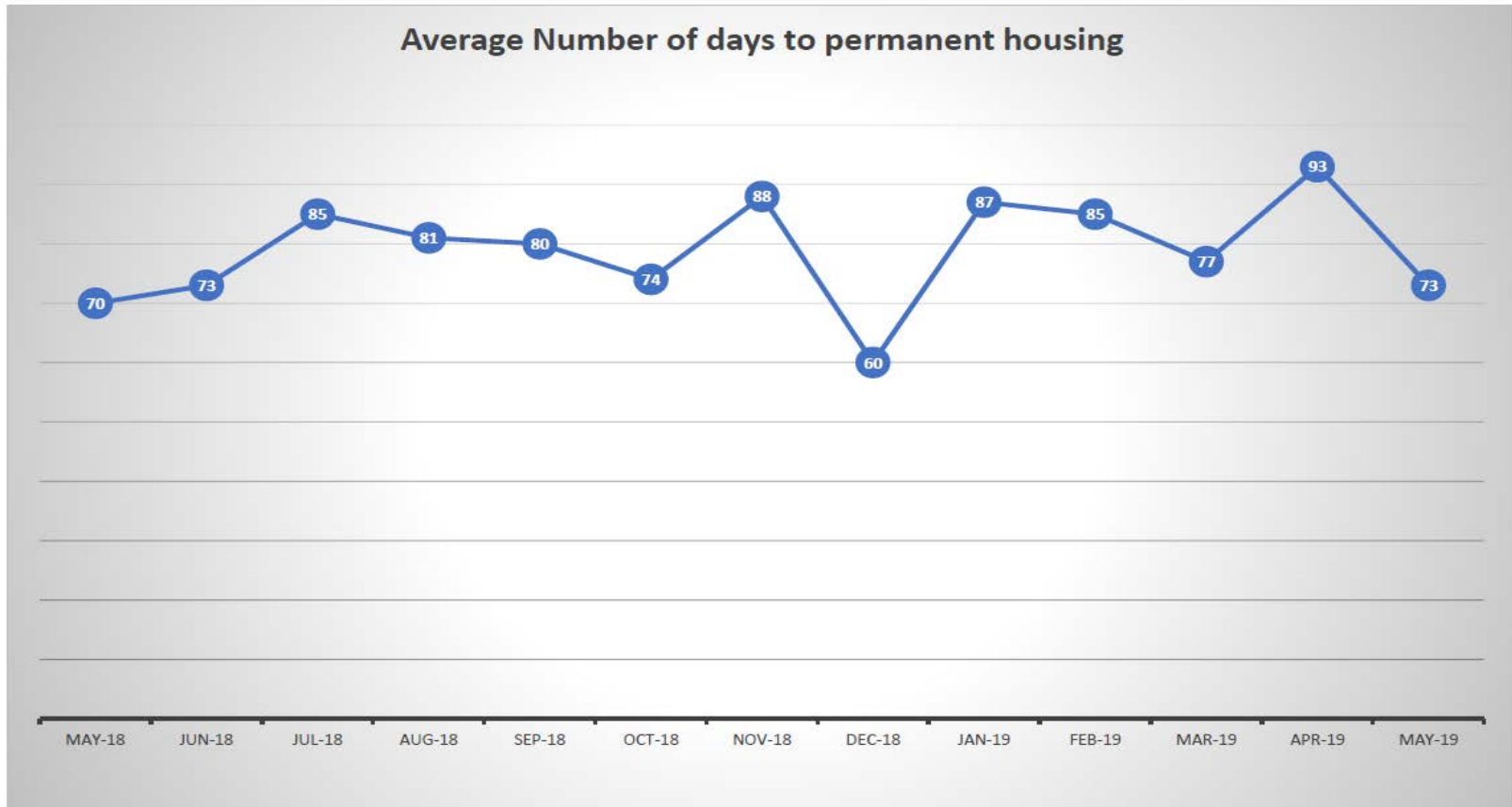
Active Veteran Homeless Population – May 2019



Number of Veterans Exiting to Permanent Housing

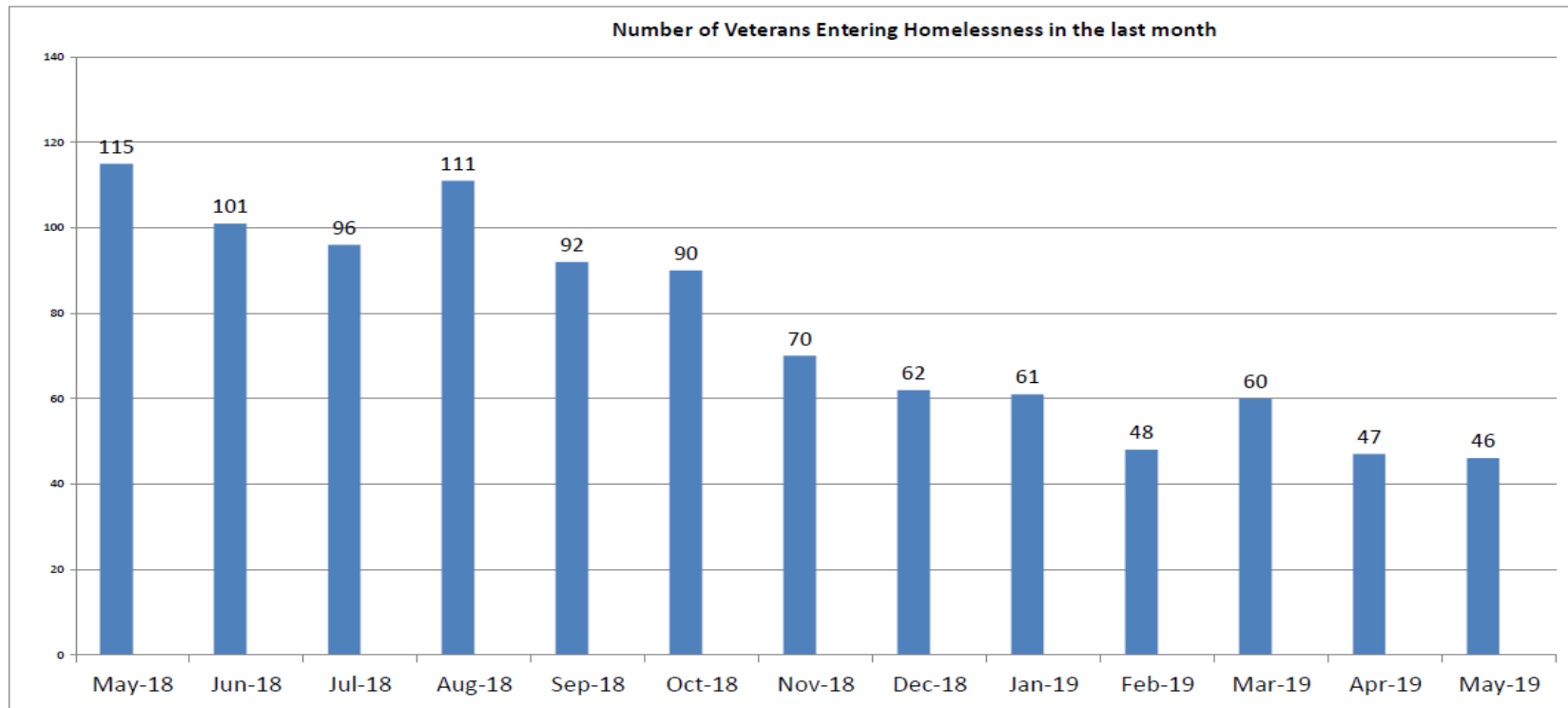


Average Number of Days to Permanent Housing



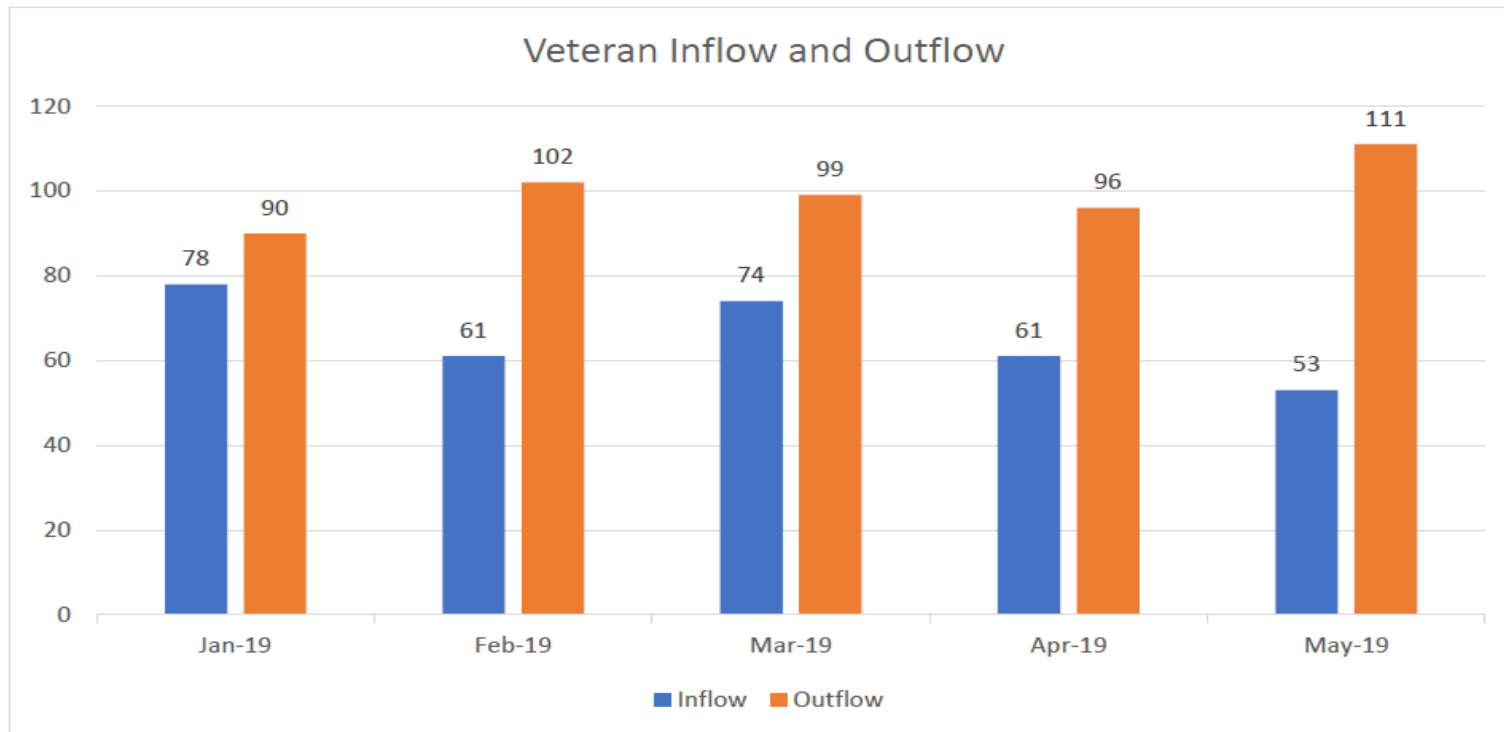
Number of Veterans Entering Homelessness in the Last Month

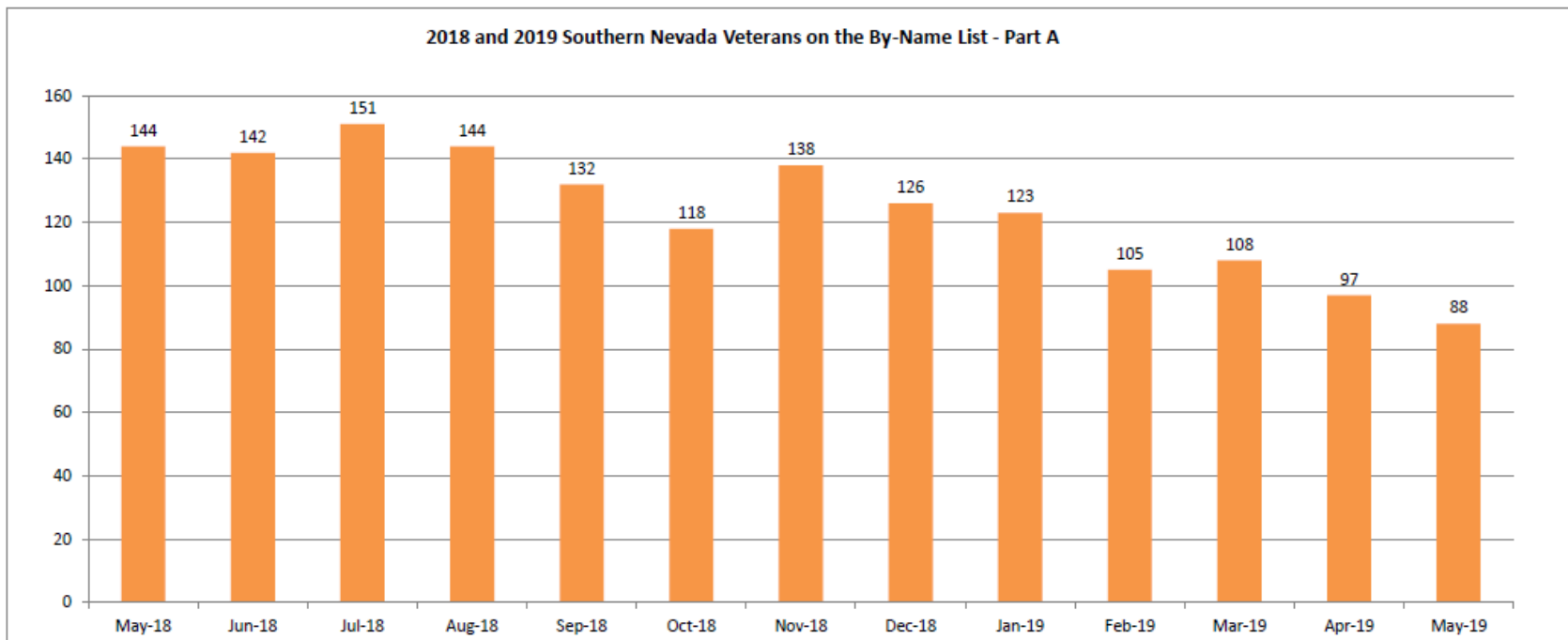


Monthly Total Veteran Inflow and Outflow

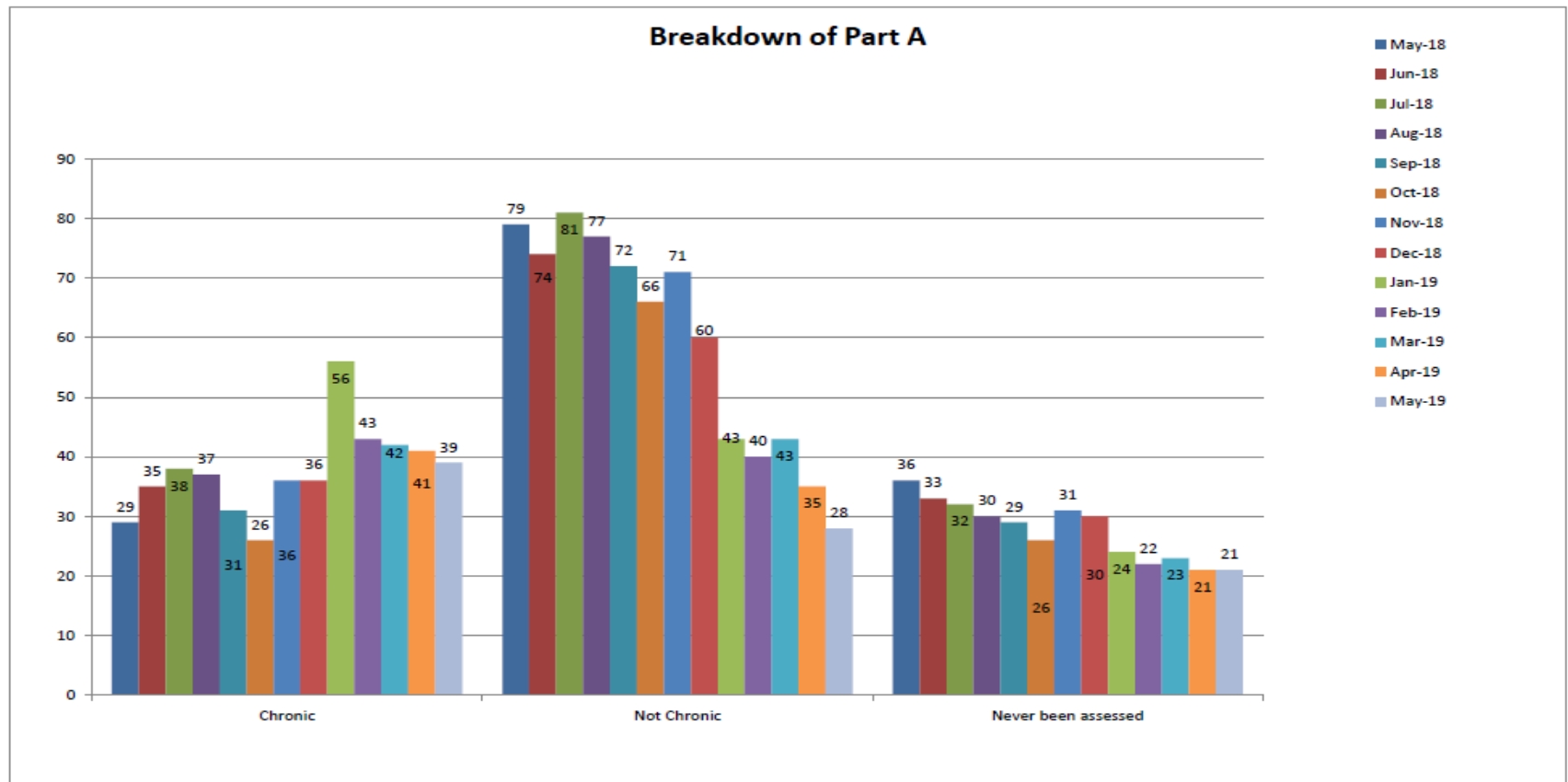


Number of Veterans on Part A of the By-Name List

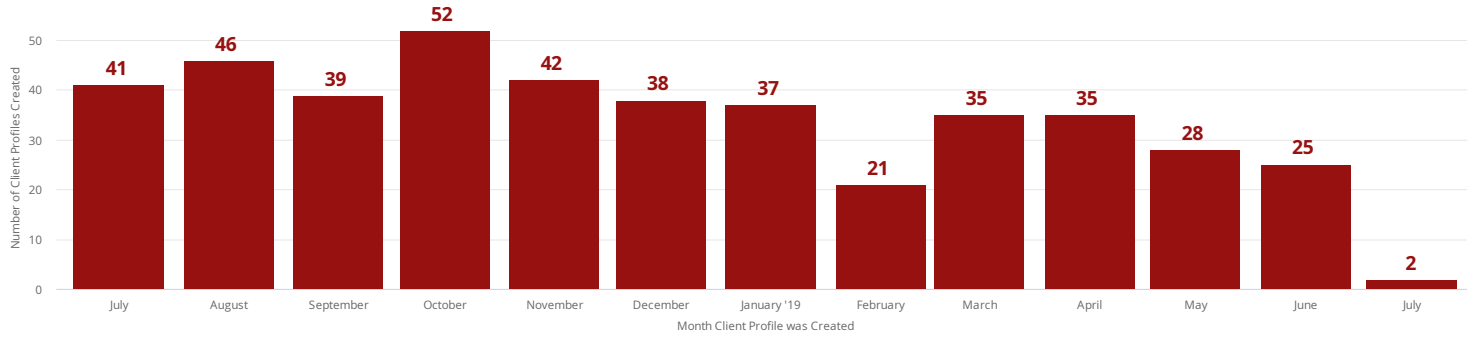

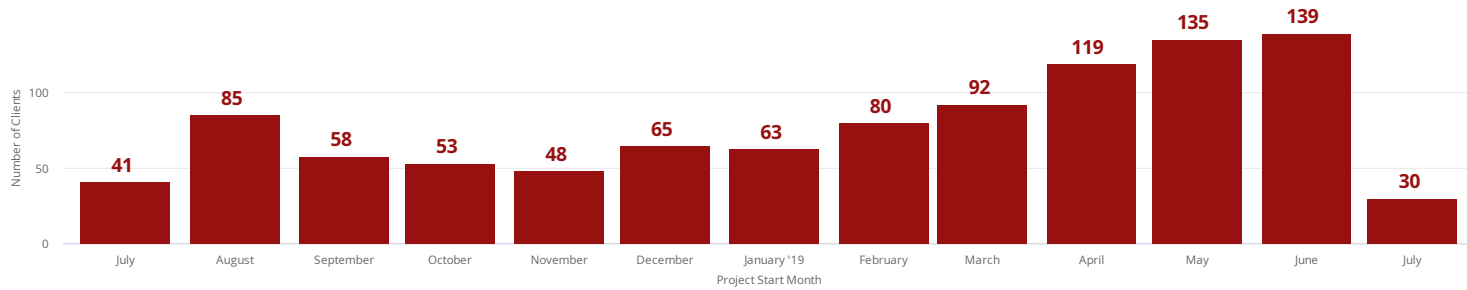

Inbound Recidivism: Count of CH Clients with a New Enrollment who Had Previously Been Stably Housed



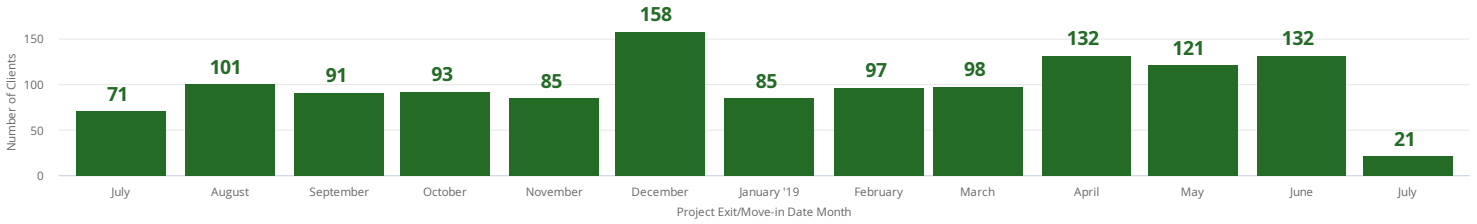
These clients have yet to be housed through their new enrollment. Therefore, these counts only include recidivism clients that are still on the BFZ list.

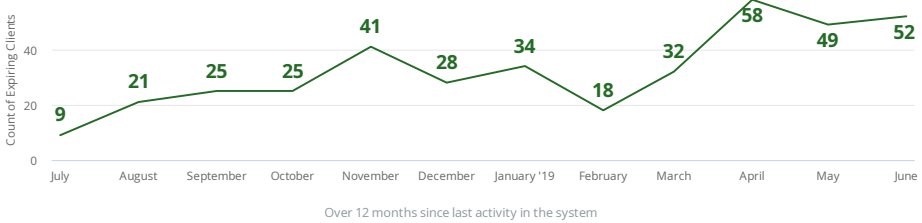

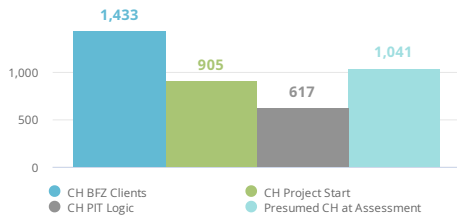

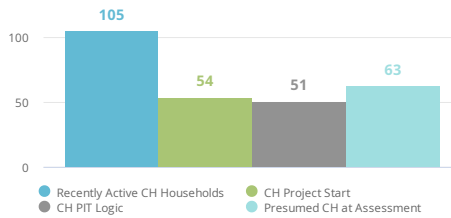

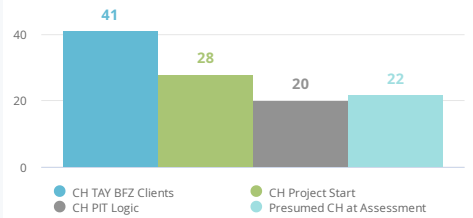
CH BFZ by CH Determination Method

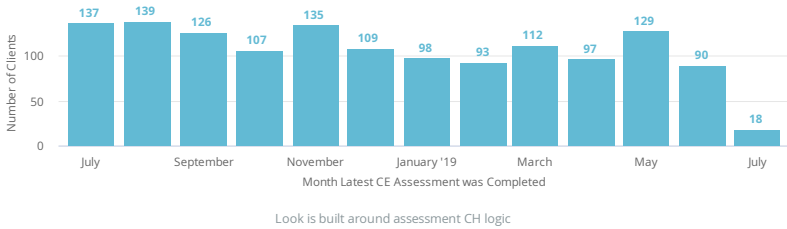

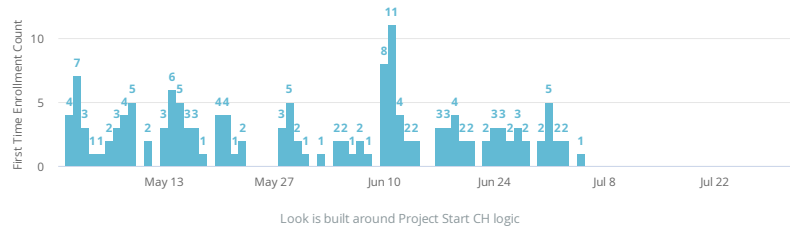
Children in CH Families with a Referral on the Queue

Unsheltered and In Shelter Statistics

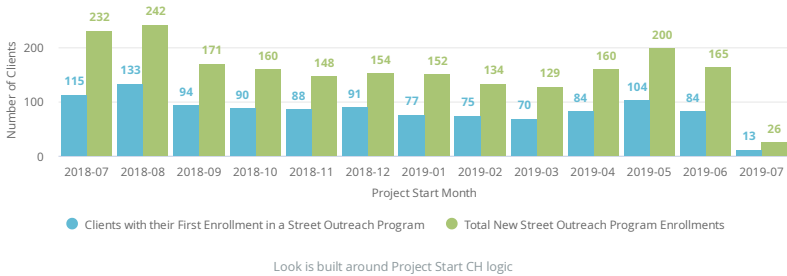
Presumed CH Clients Who Were Unsheltered in their Latest CE Assessment



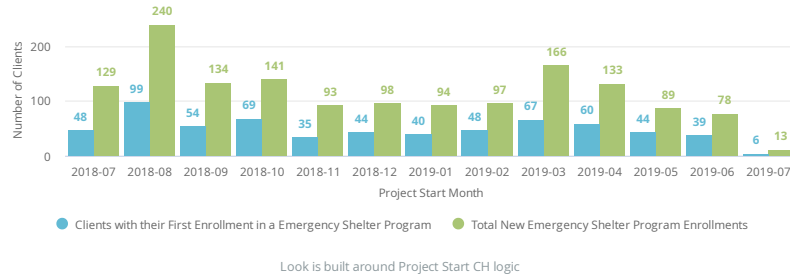
Daily Count CH at Project Start making their First Ever System Enrollments at a SO or ES



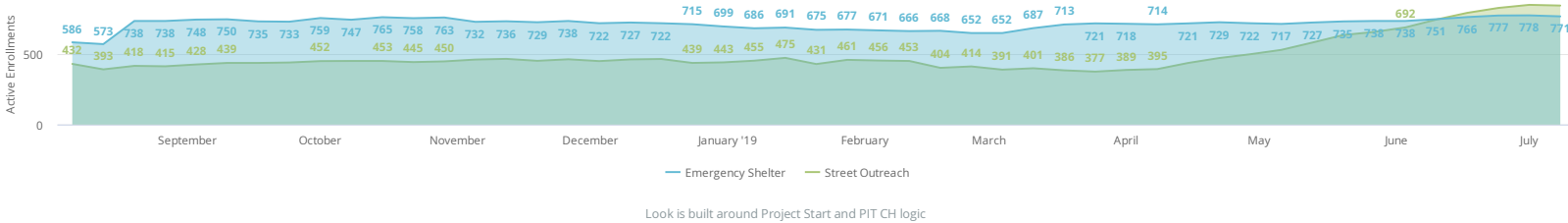
CH at Project Start Street Outreach Program Enrollments by Month



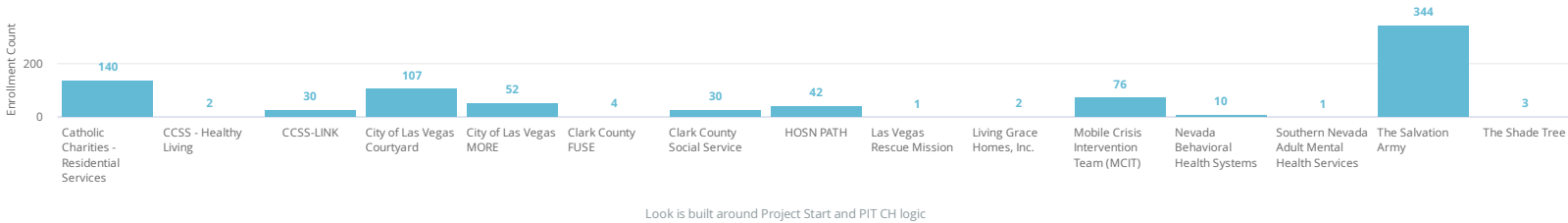
CH at Project Start Emergency Shelter Program Enrollments by Month

Become the **first large community** in the nation to both end chronic homelessness and sustain an end to veteran homelessness.

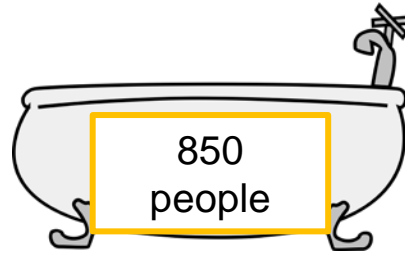

Highlights of Progress:

- Developing Family Diversion Pilot
- Identified Assessment sites: LSSN, Family Promise, Hopelink, HELP, CLV Courtyard, MORE
- Working with SSVF providers to implement Rapid Resolution.
Identified Assessment sites: US Vets, The Salvation Army
- Will collect data in HMIS

Next steps

- Conduct Diversion training to staff
- Establish a flexible funding pool
- Determine who will be the fiscal agent of the flexible funding pool

Housing Campaign

- **Highlights of Progress:**
- Raised \$427,000 in private dollars from Sands and leveraged \$410,000 in County funding for 50 additional units, and a peer support specialist so far.

Moving-On Strategy

Next Meeting: First Monday of each month at 1:30pm at the Social Service Training room, 3rd floor (1600 Pinto Lane)

Highlights of Progress:

- Finalized the assessment tool to help identify potential clients/ tenants
- Piloted tool in a few programs
- Developed an outline for training the community and service providers on Moving On and our process
- Surveying PSH providers to get baseline data on possible number of moving on clients/ tenants, the amount of subsidy needed and any other barriers
- Developed a Results Based Framework utilizing an Intervention Tool Analysis with the Unsheltered TA team.
- Established specific goals and outcomes for the program
- Identified a potential funding source for initial shallow subsidies

Next steps:

- Finalize policy and procedures
- Developing a training sub-group to develop a detailed curriculum
- Revise survey to include RRH and TH providers
- Develop staffing plan and/ or program plan for the use of potential funding source
