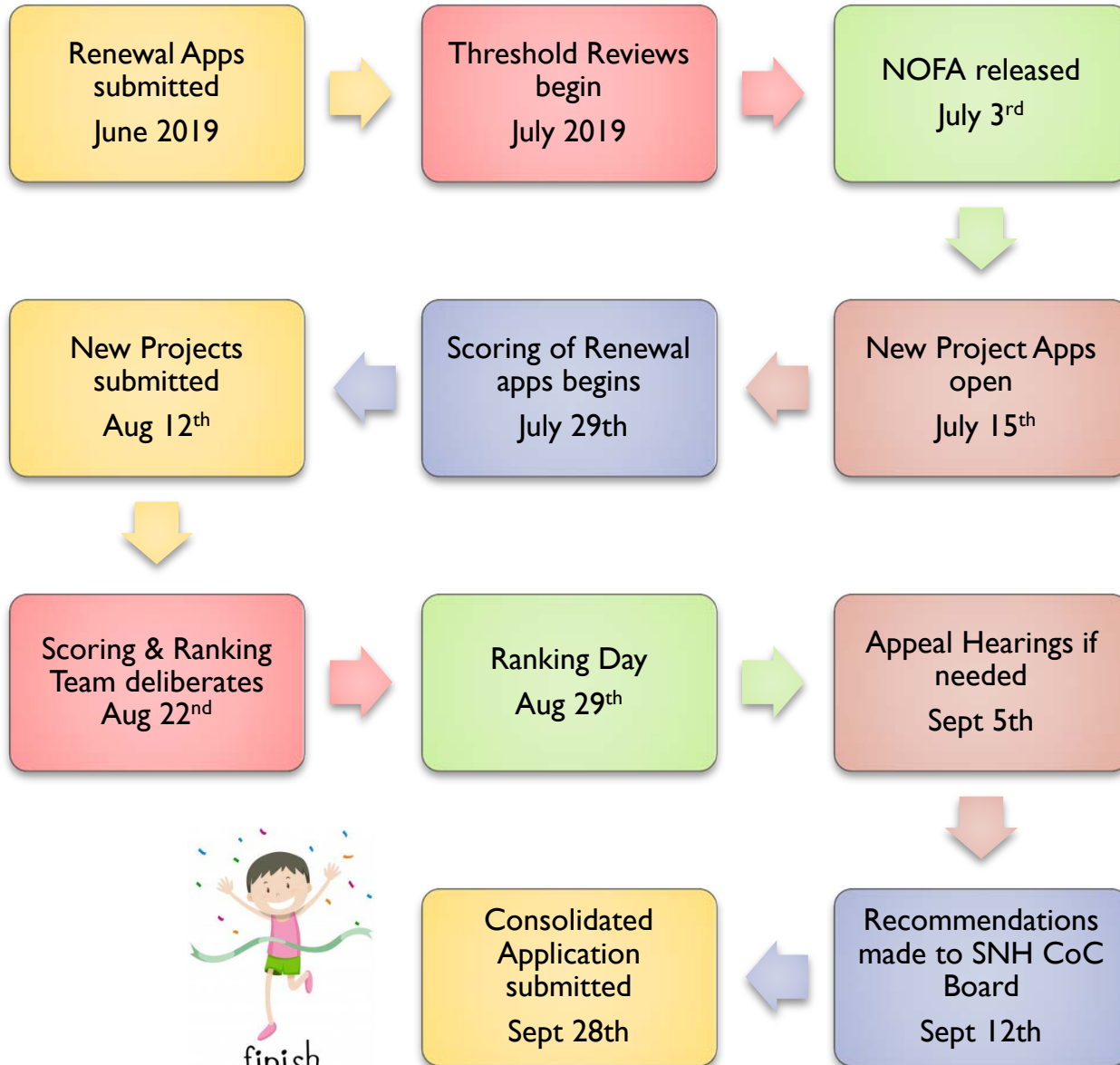



2018 YOUTH HOMELESSness DEMONSTRATION PROGRAM Round 3

EFSP PHASE 36 RELEASE OF FUNDING

United Way of Southern Nevada is proud to announce that Clark County, Nevada public and private organizations now have the opportunity to apply for \$1,243,503.00 in federal funds (FEMA) for Emergency Food and Shelter Programs.

Under the terms of the grant from the National Board, local agencies chosen to receive funds must: 1) be private voluntary non-profits or units of the government; 2) be eligible to receive Federal funds; 3) have an accounting system; 4) practice nondiscrimination; 5) have demonstrated the capability to deliver emergency food and/or shelter programs; and 6) if they are a private voluntary organization, have a voluntary board. Qualifying agencies are urged to apply.

2019 Southern Nevada Local HUD Continuum of Care Application*

Each year the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) releases a Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) for the HUD Continuum of Care Homeless Funds. The Southern Nevada Homelessness Continuum of Care (CoC) Evaluation Working Group is releasing a CoC Local Application in preparation of the HUD local process expected for release in May 2019. Information from this local application will be used to determine inclusion in the 2019 Consolidated Application to HUD for the CoC Homeless Assistance funds.

Note: The Continuum of Care Local Application is mandatory for anyone who wishes to participate in this year's Southern Nevada Consolidated Application. For 2019, the Local HUD CoC Project Application is an electronic submission through PRESTO.

The application along with companion documentation can be found below. Agencies will not have access to PRESTO to submit applications until after completing Mandatory Application and Technical Assistance Training.

What's New?

- **Commitment to Housing First**
 - Low barrier to entry into housing
 - May implement service participation requirements once stably housed
- **DV Bonus - \$1,129,323**
 - May submit one SSO-CE project
 - No limit on RRH or Joint TH-RRH projects



DV Bonus Calculations

- For RRH and Joint TH-RRH component projects:
 - Up to 25 points in direct proportion to the score received on the CoC Application.
 - Up to 25 points based on the extent the CoC quantifies the need for the project in its portfolio, the extent of the need, and how the project will fill that gap.
 - Up to 50 points based on the previous performance of the applicant in serving survivors of domestic violence, dating violence, or stalking, and their ability to house survivors and meet safety outcomes. Additionally, to be eligible to receive a PH-RRH or Joint TH and PH-RRH project, the CoC must demonstrate that the project will use trauma-informed, victim-centered approaches.
- For SSO Projects for Coordinated Entry:
 - Up to 50 points in direct proportion to the score received on the CoC Application.
 - Up to 50 points based on the extent to which the CoC demonstrates the need for a coordinated entry system that better meets the needs of survivors of domestic violence, dating violence, or stalking, and how the project will fill this need.



Data Driven Priorities

As determined by Data & Systems Improvement Working Group:

- Preserve the programs in our system that are high-performing
- Prioritize Dedicated Plus for any new or reallocated funds for PSH
- Prioritize an increase in RRH for AWOCs

Project Capacity, Review & Ranking

29 points possible

Strengthen the scoring and ranking process

Determine cost effectiveness

Evaluate DV projects based on degree they improve safety

Consider vulnerabilities of clients during scoring, ranking, monitoring

Define a standard process for reallocation including thresholds for performance



System Performance

60 points possible

Decrease sheltered and unsheltered population

Reduction in first time homeless, length of time homeless and returns to homelessness

Increase exits to permanent housing

Increase in income from employment and non-employment cash sources



HMIS

9 points possible

85% bed coverage rate and submit data by deadlines

PIT Count

6 points possible

Conduct a count and submit data and engage stakeholders



Performance and Strategic Planning

40 points possible

Decrease number of chronically homeless and number of households with children and youth experiencing homelessness

Written agreements between CoC and educational supports for children ages 0 – 5

Address unique circumstances of youth including trafficking and exploitation

Prioritize youth for assistance; Increase housing and assistance for youth

Formal partnership with school district

Reduce veteran homelessness; reduce number of unsheltered veterans



CoC Coordination and Engagement

56 points possible

Have a broad array of stakeholders

Transparent processes to join, share opinions and apply for funding

Implemented CoC-wide anti-discrimination policies

PHAs have established admission preference and at least 20 % of new admissions are homeless at admission

Street outreach and Coordinated Entry covers entire geographic area

Increase number of RRH beds

Increase access to education and employment opportunities including written agreements and established programs

Increase volunteerism and community service among people experiencing homelessness.
