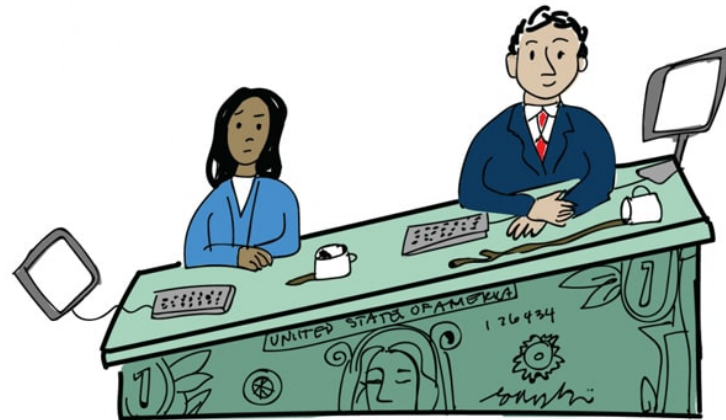
**An initial analysis of Southern Nevada

LIMITATIONS:

- Process / eligibility flow was NOT assessed.
- Subpopulation was NOT included in assessment.
- Ethnicity was NOT included in the assessment.

WHAT IS DISPARITY?

- “a great difference”
- When one group in an event is not equal to the ratio of another group in the same event

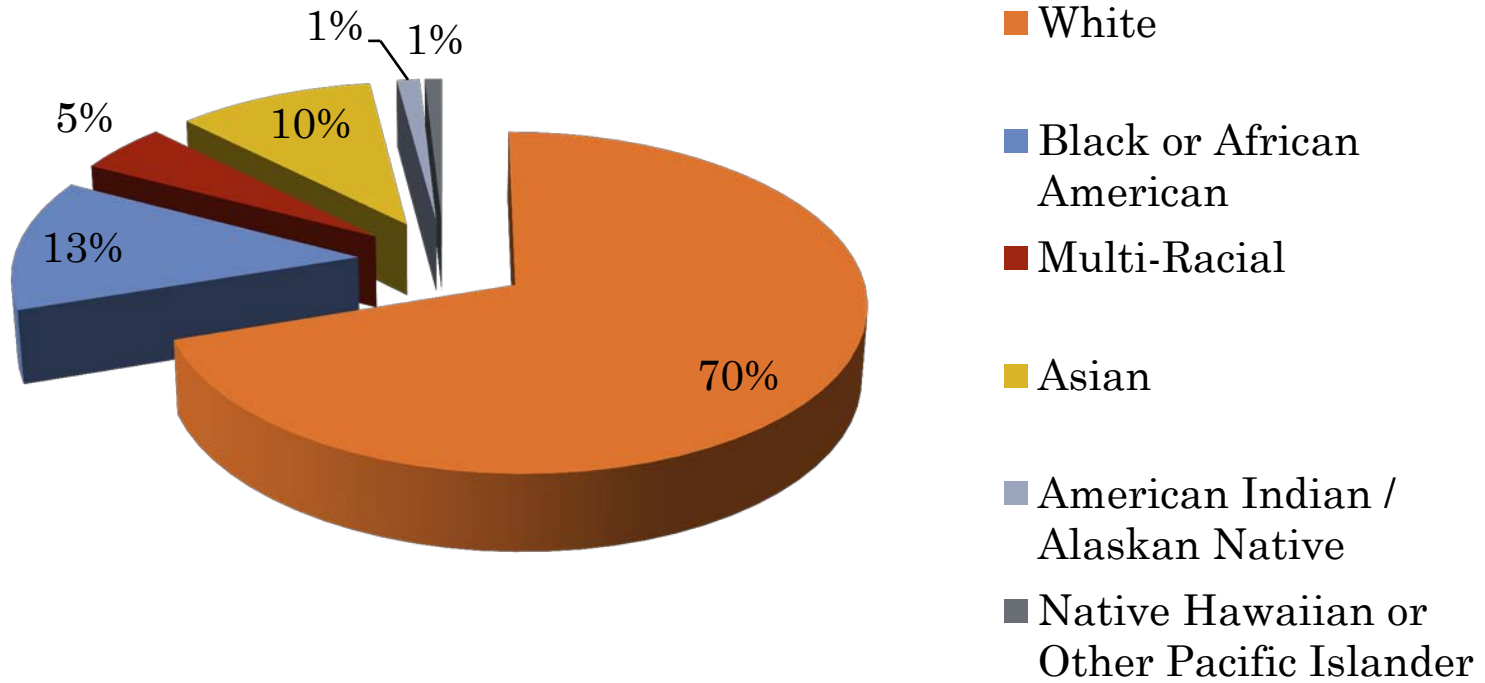


RACIAL DISPROPORTIONALITY VS RACIAL DISPARITY

- Disproportionality:
 - a state of being out of proportion. A condition when the percent of persons of a certain race or ethnicity in a target population differs from the percentage of persons of the same group in a reference (or base) population
- Disparity:
 - when the ratio of one racial or ethnic group in an event is not equal to the ratio of another racial or ethnic group who experienced the same event

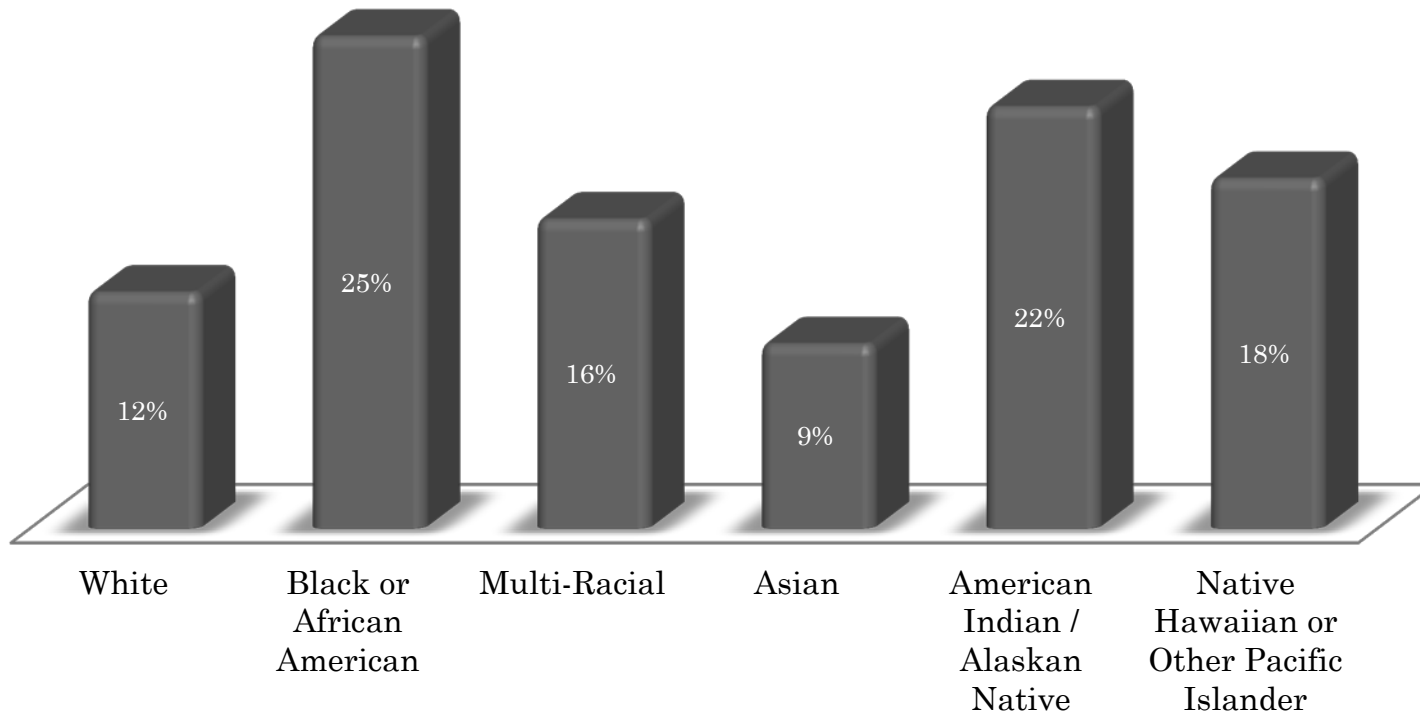
Clark County Census by Race (v2018)

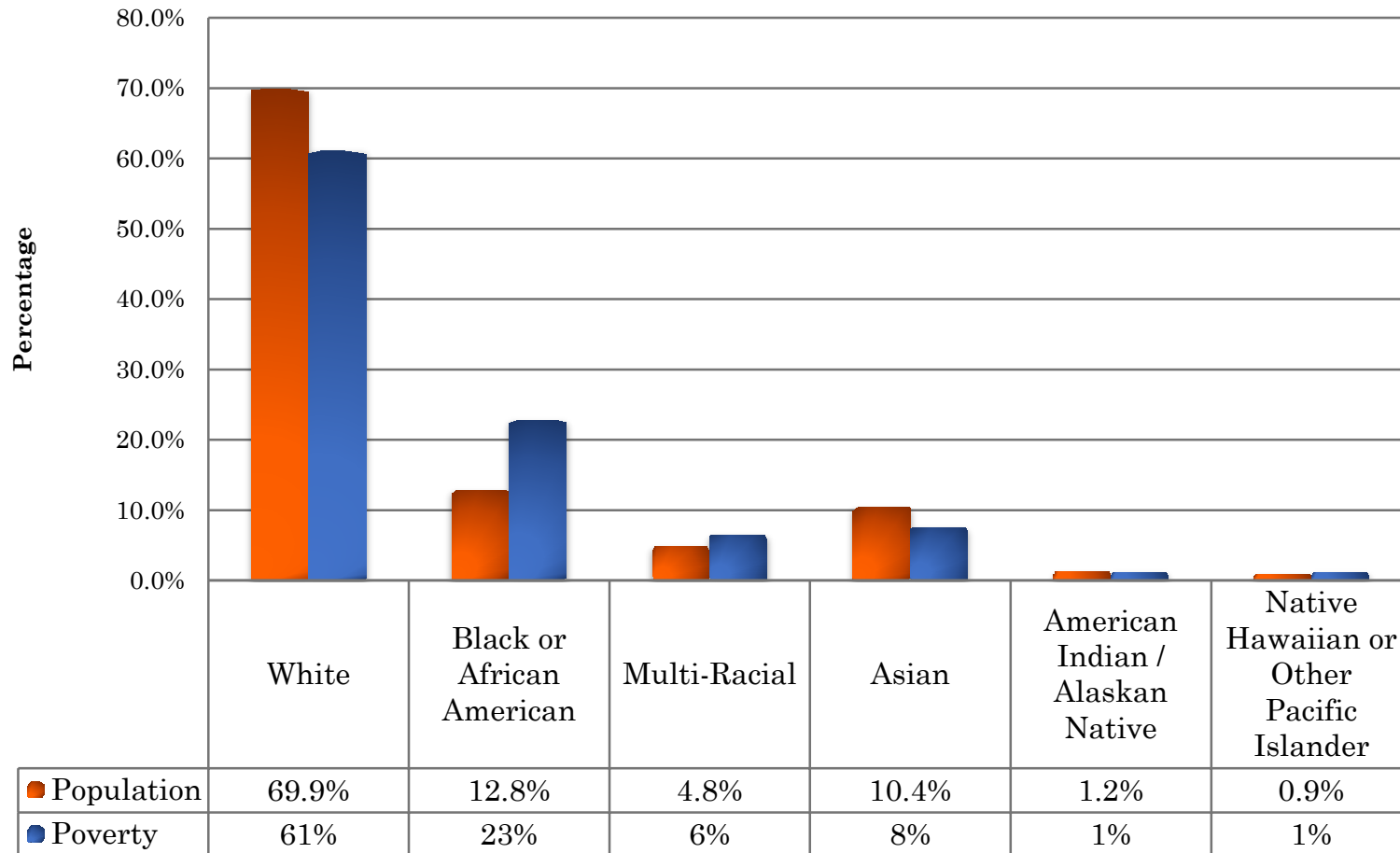
Clark County Poverty by Race

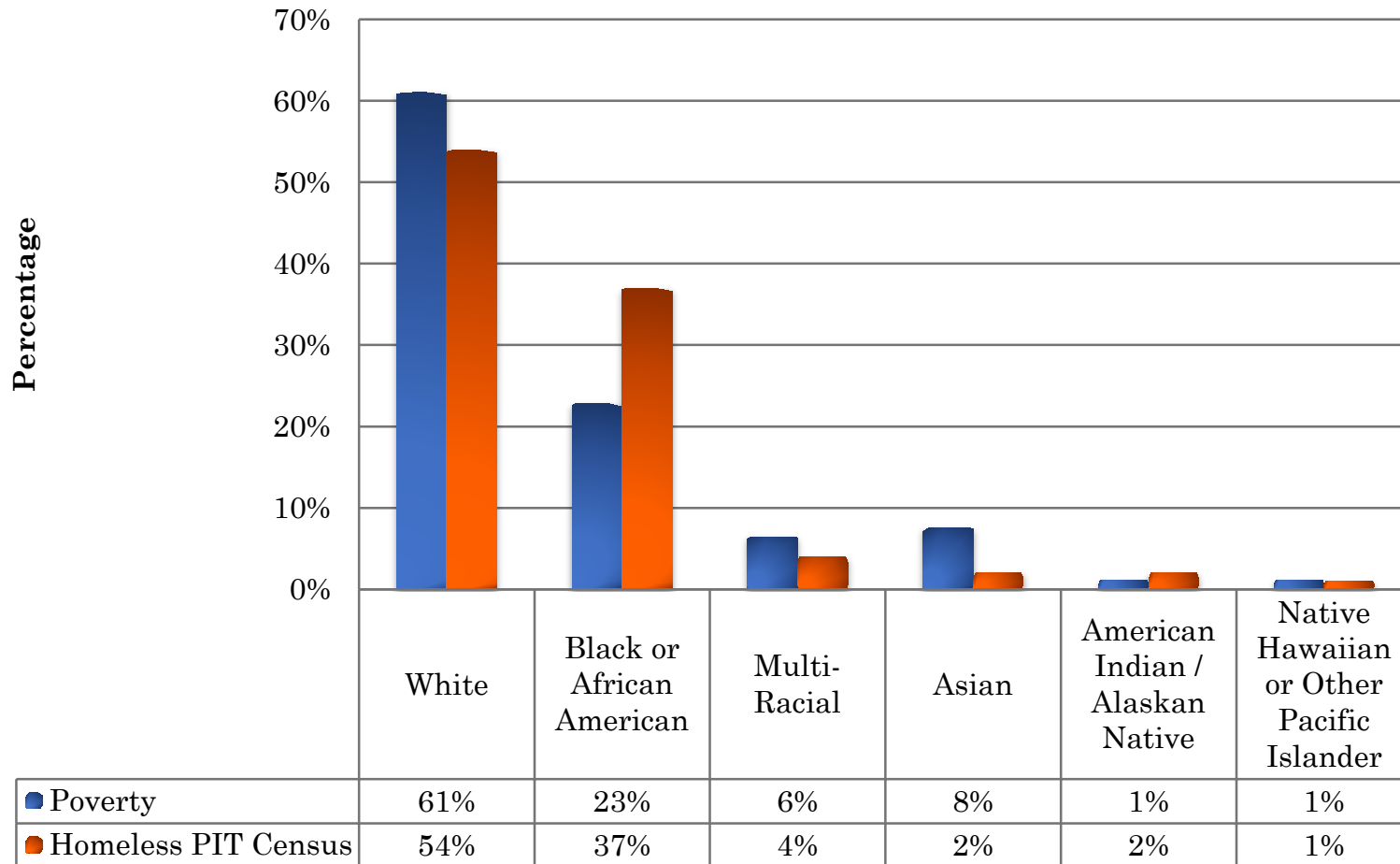

Population vs Poverty



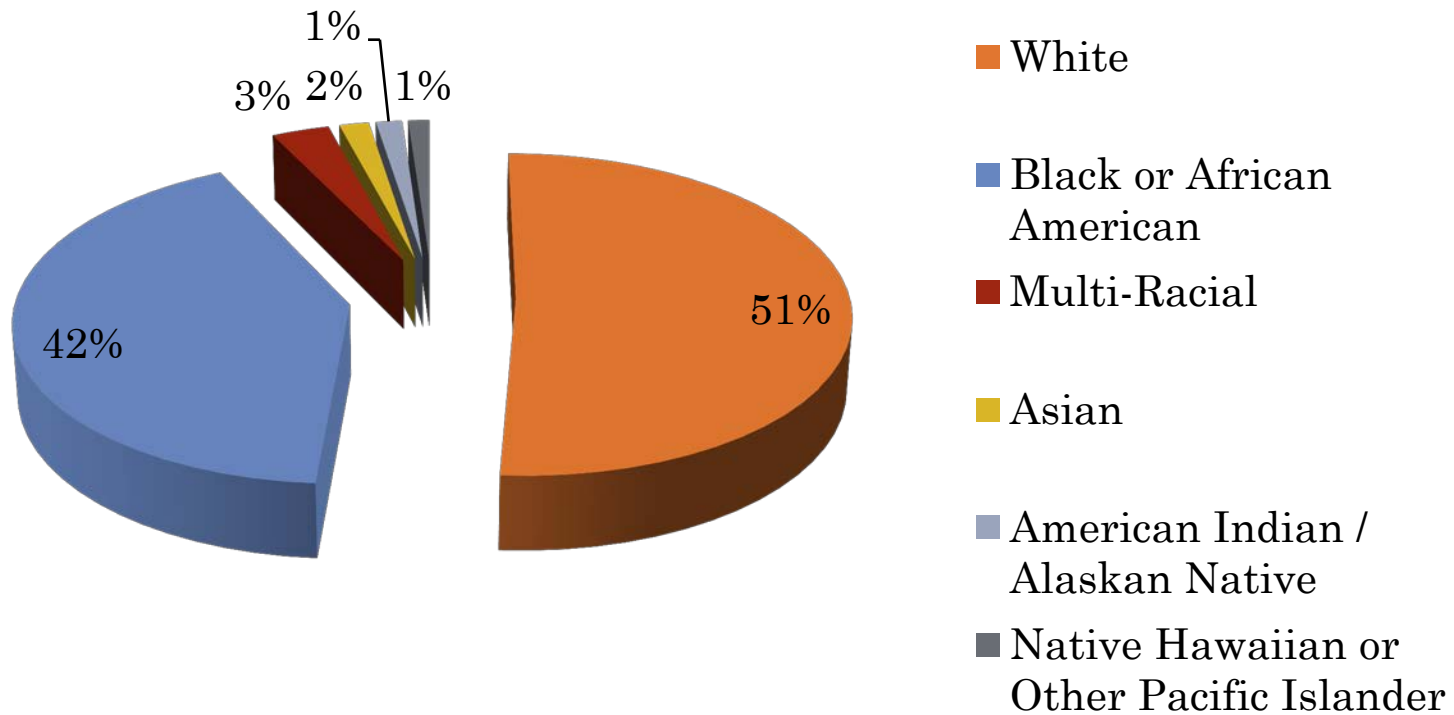

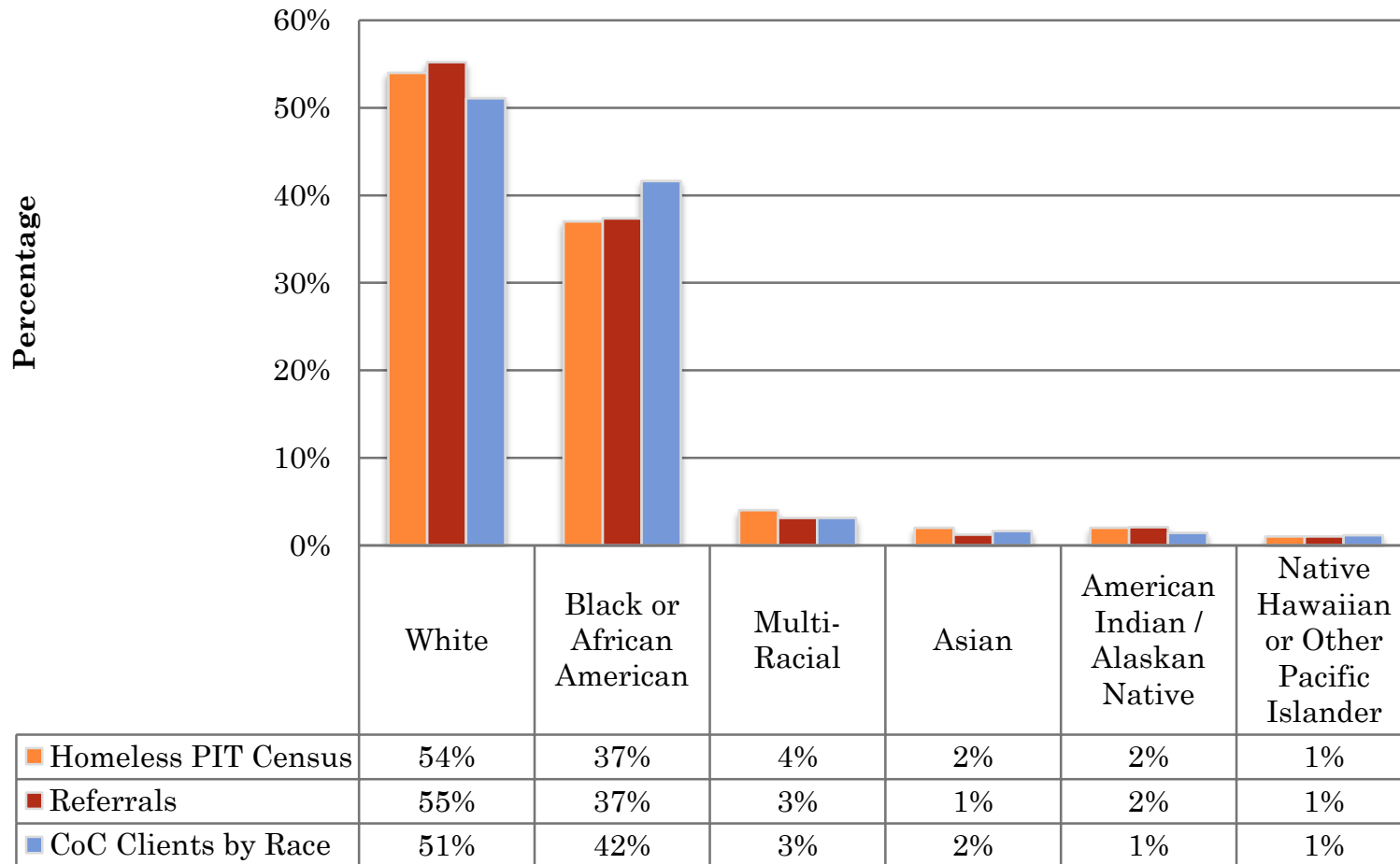

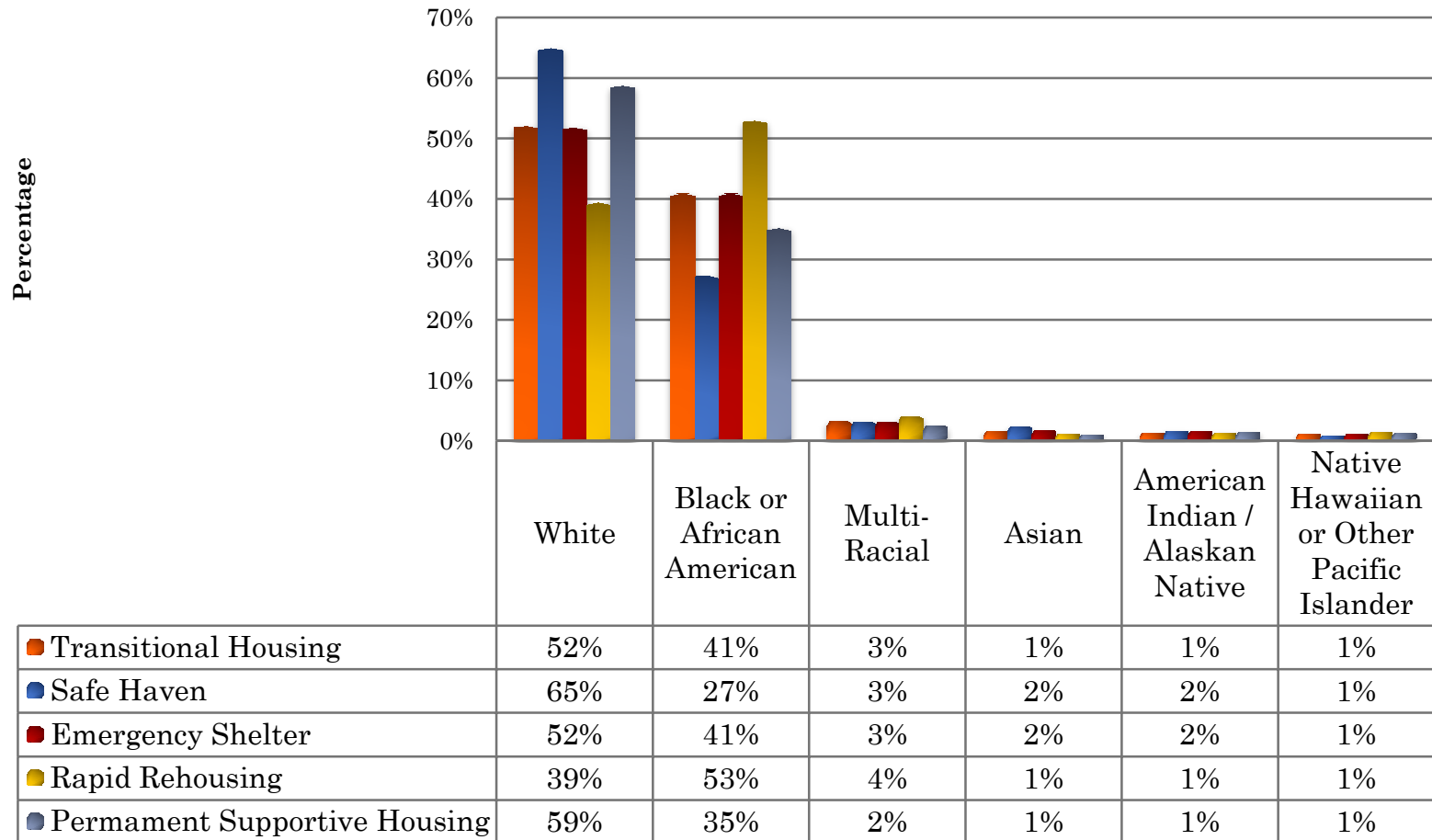

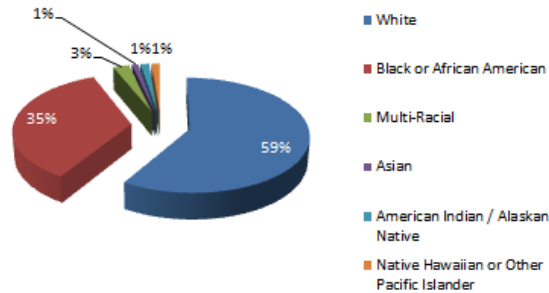

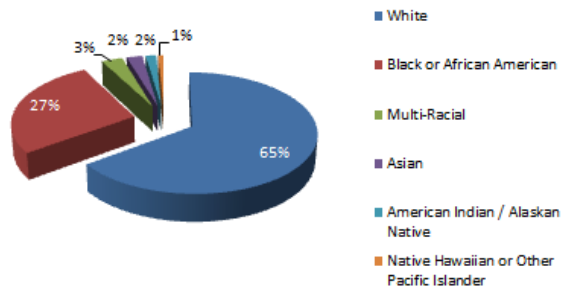

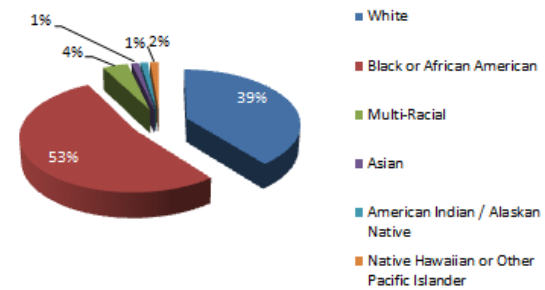

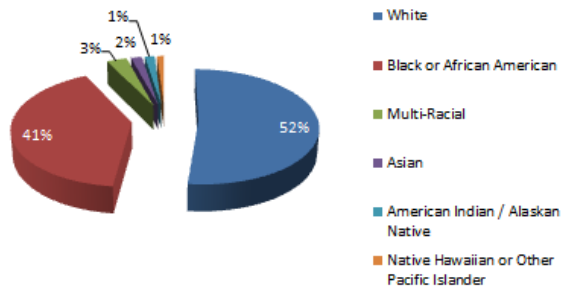
Safe Haven



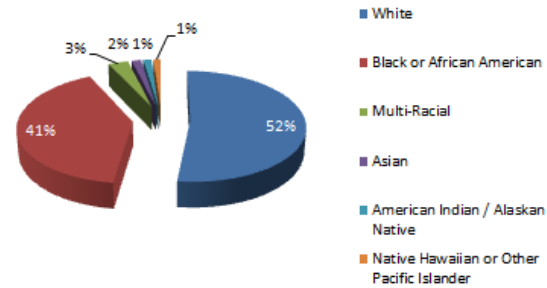
Rapid Rehousing



Emergency Shelter

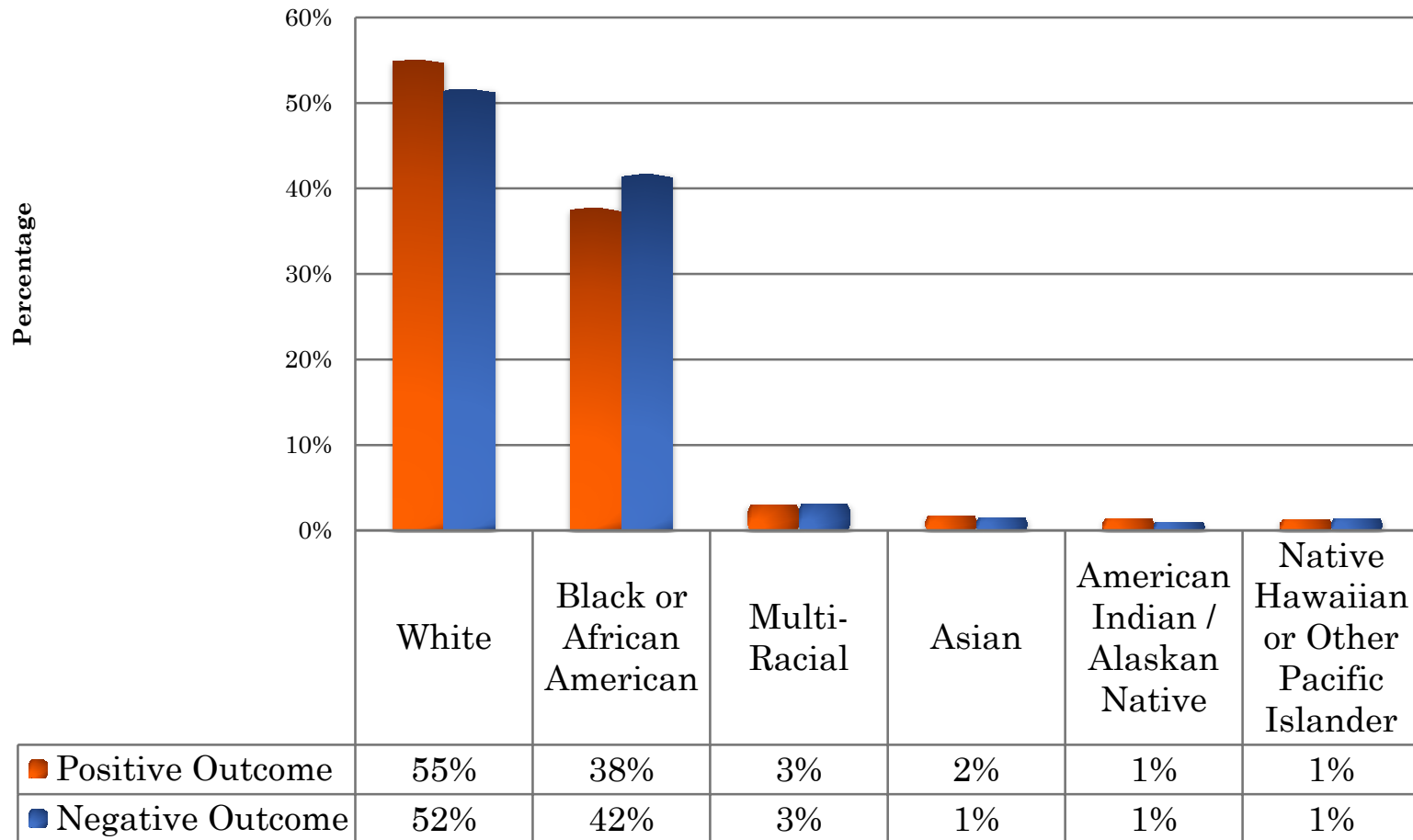


Transitional Housing
