# Overall Scores for all CoC's

# High Priority CoC Questions

## STRENGTHS

(Awarded Full Points)

- Reduced First Time Homeless (3A-1)
- Increased Successful Permanent Housing Placement & Retention (3A-3)
  - Exits to PH from ES, SH, TH, and RRH or PSH retention
- Submitted System Performance Measures Data in HDX on time (3A-6)
- Prioritized households with children based on need (3B-1a)
- Provided low barriers to project entry and prioritized rapid placement in permanent housing (4A-2)
- Provided 100% geographic coverage for regular street outreach targeted to hard to reach individuals (4A-3)
- *Honorable mention (80% of pts): Increased participant income and promoted opportunities for employment, volunteerism, & community service (3A-5)*

# High Priority CoC Questions

## AREAS FOR IMPROVEMENT

(Awarded less than 2/3 of available points)

- Demonstrate objective criteria of project ranking & selection process
  - Factors should evaluate how projects improve system performance (e.g., housing stability, income), increase safety for DV survivors, and serve those with severe needs & vulnerabilities (1E-2, 1E-3)
- Demonstrate at least 85% HMIS bed coverage for all project types (2A-2)
- Demonstrate a 5% reduction in Length-of-Time of Homeless and a clear strategy to reduce it (3A-2)
- Demonstrate 5% reductions in Returns to Homelessness at 6- & 12-months from PH exit and a clear strategy to reduce these rates (3A-4)
- Demonstrate an increase in the number of Rapid Rehousing beds (4A-4)

# CoC Summary Takeaways

- As described earlier, there's room for improvement in Project Capacity, Review, and Ranking (1E)
  - New monitoring process and updated policies & procedures should greatly support this
- PIT Count scoring was very strong – awarded full points! (2B)
- HMIS scoring was also strong – awarded 78% of points (2A)
- However, as in many communities, data entry, quality, & coverage (related to HIC, PIT, HMIS, & SPMs) represent one of the biggest areas to improve CoC scoring (2B, 3A, 3B-2, 4A-5, PIT).
- All 6 scored sections received roughly 70% or more of available points

# DV Bonus Debrief

- 2 projects applied
  - TH-RRH score: 50.13
  - SSO-CE score: 63.25
- Lowest score of any project funded: 66.5
- Median score: 60.88
- Highest score: 93.56
- Lowest score: 14.69



# DV Bonus Debrief Takeaways

- Increasing the overall CoC Application score will improve the ranking for DV bonus applicants
- Improve the arguments for the CoC's need for a prospective project
- Ensure project applicants can demonstrate:
  - Strong past performance in serving survivors;
  - Use of trauma-informed victim-centered approaches; and
  - Ability to house survivors and meet safety outcomes
