Eviction Moratorium Update

- Statewide Moratorium
 - Prohibits evictions based on non-payment of rent through 10/14/20 at 11:59 p.m.
 - Landlords can charge late fees per lease terms except for the period 3/29/20 - 9/1/20

Eviction Moratorium Update

- Federal/CDC Moratorium
 - Prohibits evictions through 12/31/20 for "covered" tenants
 - Protection extends to nonpayment of rent, and tenants whose leases expire, no cause evictions, tenants at will
 - Allows evictions for only 5 different scenarios
 - 1. Engaging in criminal activity on the premises
 - 2. Threats to health/safety of another resident
 - 3. Damages or poses immediate & significant risk of damage to the property
 - 4. Violates building code, health ordinance, or similar regulation relating to health/safety
 - 5. Violates any other contractual obligation OTHER THAN the timely payment of rent or house related payment, including late fees, penalties or interest assessed per lease terms

"Covered" Tenant MUST sign & deliver declaration form:

- 1. You used best effort to obtain all available government assistance for rent or housing
- 2. You expect to earn no more than \$99,000 during 2020, you were not required to report income to the IRS in 2019, or you received a stimulus check under the federal CARES Act
- 3. You are unable to pay the full rent due to substantial loss of household income, reduction in wages or hours, layoff, or extraordinary out-of-pocket medical expenses
- 4. You are using best efforts to make partial payments of rent as close to full payment your circumstances permit AND
- 5. You will likely be rendered homeless or forced to move and live in close quarters in a shared living setting if evicted.

Eviction Mediation Program

- Senate Bill 1
 - Authorizes Nevada courts to establish rules for a mediation program
 - Evictions may be stayed for up to 30 days
 - Sept. 22: hearing on mediation rule changes
