Accomplishments - Action Items Completed:

- The group discussed questions that were posed to the group from CE providers regarding COVID-19 and the housing assessment.
- The group discussed whether a client should be re-assessed after hospitalization due to COVID-19.
- Group discussed how to assess clients at new Southern Nevada Health District Isolation and Recovery Unit.
- How many clients have been released from the ISOQ without a housing assessment.
- The client can be re-assessed if a health related change impacts the client's life significantly.
- New client health changes can be documented in the referral notes tab
- Matchers should not client re-assessed due to change in medical condition.
- Group discussed the request from Community Solutions and Nash to review the Coordinated Entry Assessment tools.
- Assessment tools could be put through a racial equity evaluation.
- Group discussed the status of the Emergency Shelter Queue process.
- Bitfocus is still reaching out to providers regarding the Emergency Shelter Queue.
- Currently 231 clients on the Queue.
- The Group discussed the Housing Surge Coordination goal.
- A smaller group will meet to discuss the housing surge coordination.
- Group will discuss COVID-19 and the Emergency Shelter Queue.

 - Current clients on the queue is 1543
 - 561 are listed as Chronically Homeless.
 - 110 families on the queue; 1010 youth on the queue; not chronic with income 359; veterans 38.
- Group members stated that the new process for Coordinated Entry is confusing.
- Clients that are in bridge housing need a new housing assessment.
- Issue will be brought to the Leadership team.

- Wound Care Training from Touro University (Rebecca Edgeworth)



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- Introduction to Clean the World (Sam Stephens)
 - CDC Project for Encampments Pilot in Las Vegas with portapotties and hand washing stations in the community,
 - Locations for areas that can be allowed to house the units
 - Mobile Shower Project with Clark County
 - Three more units to be rolled out, first in mid-late November, rest will be available by end of January
- Introduction to updated Clarity Outreach function
 - Full demo at November 19th Coordinated Outreach Meeting
- Updates from Teams on Areas of Concern
 - Casa Blanca Hotel off of Carey in North Las Vegas
 - Housed 16, most are COVID-19 vulnerable, some in Rita Suites
 - Conducting housing assessments, transports to shelter and alternate housing locations that are also provided by CNLV
 - Maybe about 40 people, some fled, families were first assisted (family of 10, two groups of 2)
 - Owens & B pushing further north towards the train tracks
 - Encampment has fewer people and are moving north in tunnel under Lake Mead Blvd.
 - Pop Up assisted about 50 people last week, fewer people than usual
