2021 Southern Nevada Local HUD Continuum of Care Application

Each year the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) releases a Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) for the HUD Continuum of Care Homeless Funds. The Southern Nevada Homelessness Continuum of Care (CoC) Evaluation Working Group is releasing a CoC Local Application in preparation of the HUD local process expected for release in May 2019. Information from this local application will be used to determine inclusion in the 2021 Consolidated Application to HUD for

Note: The Continuum of Care Local Application is mandatory for anyone who wishes to participate in this year's Southern Nevada Consolidated Application. For 2021, the Local HUD CoC Project Application is an electronic submission through PRESTO.

The application along with companion documentation can be found below. Agencies will not have access to PRESTO to submit applications until after completing Mandatory Application and Technical Assistance Training.

- DV Bonus \$2,032,238
 - Eligible Component Types:
 - RRH
 - TH-RRH
 - DV SSO-CE (x1)





DV Bonus Calculations

- For Rapid Rehousing and Joint Transitional Housing and Rapid Rehousing:
 - CoC Score: Up to 50 points in direct proportion to the score received on the CoC Application.
 - Need for the Project: Up to 25 points based on the extent the CoC quantifies the need for the project in its portfolio, the extent of the need, and how the project will fill that gap.
 - Quality of the Project Applicant. Up to 25 points based on the previous performance of the applicant in serving survivors of domestic violence, dating violence, and/or stalking and their ability to house survivors and meet safety outcomes. Additionally, Rapid Rehousing and Joint TH and PH-RRH component projects must follow a housing first approach.
- For Supportive Services Only Projects for Coordinated Entry:
 - CoC Score. Up to 50 points in direct proportion to the score received on the CoC Application
 - Need for the Project. Up to 50 points based on the extent to which the CoC demonstrates the need for a Coordinated Entry system that better meets the needs of survivors of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and/or stalking and how the project will fill this need.

Data Driven Priorities

As determined by Data & Systems Improvement Working Group:

- Preserve the programs in our system that are high-performing
- Prioritize Dedicated Plus for any new or reallocated funds for PSH
- Prioritize an increase in RRH for Adults without Children

II points possible

85% bed coverage rate and submit data by deadlines

Timely data submissions (Housing Inventory Count, Longitudinal Systems Analysis)

Point-In-Time (PIT) Count

3 points possible

Conduct a count and submit data and engage stakeholders

Effectiveness of youth count (2022)







96 points possible

Have a broad array of stakeholders; investment in Housing First principles

Transparent and coordinated processes

Open forums for funding and policy development

Open to proposals from organizations not yet receiving CoC funding

Coordination with Fed, State, Local, Private, and other organizations for housing, outreach, decriminalization, benefits access, elevating lived experience

Preservation of family units; collaboration toward children and youth

Addressing unique needs of DV-survivors, LGBT community, racial equity

Addressing COVID-19 within the CoC's geographic area

Coordination with local Public Housing Authority (PHA)

Discharge Planning from local institutions
