**Accomplishments - Action Items Completed:**

- **2022 Work Plan**
  - Charged with leading as it relates to the review of all data, including homeless related, and other community indicators that will assist the CoC in making data-informed recommendations and decisions and communicating those findings and recommendation the relevant working groups and the.
  - There are 5 objectives in the 2022 Work Plan.
  - **Objective 1:** On a monthly basis, monitor CoC homeless system of care, identify areas of improvement, and communicate with the appropriate stakeholders (working group) to allow for strategy development
  - **Objective 2:** Present the system modeling findings to the CoC Board by December 2022.
  - **Objective 3:** Identify the priorities of Southern Nevada by May 2022.
  - **Objective 4:** Comply with HUD's 14 minimum standards for the HIC/PIT.
  - **Objective 5:** Develop and monitor a data quality plan for our local CoC.
  - The group will continue the discussion on the 2022 Work Plan.
- **Local Priorities**
  - The setting of local priorities helps to determine how to allocate resources throughout the community.
  - The local priorities for 2022 will be data driven, impactful, and effective.
  - The group will continue the discussion around the process and prioritization of local priorities.
- **PIT Count update**
  - Debrief: was able to complete in 10 hours, difficult to get surveys completed, some locations were questionable for getting them done as too many people of 20 or more people at a tunnel.
  - Reminder to return bus passes and VA ROIs—no veterans surveyed by Alyssa
  - The Census Team has begun pulling data and performing outreach for HIC/PIT
