Application Strengths

Application Weaknesses

Awarded 0 out of 10 points – Rapid Rehousing as measured by the HIC

Awarded 3.5 out of 22 points – Project Review and Ranking Process of Your CoC Used in Its Local Competition

- At least 33% of the total points were based on objective (cost effectiveness, timely draws, utilization rate, match, leverage) performance data, type of population served (DV, youth, Veterans, chronic homelessness) type of housing (PSH, RRH)
- At least 20% of total points were based on system performance criteria (exits to PH, retention of PH, length of time homeless, returns to homelessness)
- Used data from comparable database to score projects submitted by VSP
- **Used objective criteria to evaluate how VSP improved safety for the populations they serve**
- Used specific method for evaluating projects based on CoC's analysis of rapid returns to PH
- Specific severity of needs and vulnerabilities your CoC considered when ranking and selecting projects
- Considerations your CoC gave to projects that provide housing and services to the hardest to serve populations that could result in lower performance levels but are projects the CoC needs.
