

HOME-ARP (American Rescue Plan)

Background

- American Rescue Plan (ARP) was signed into law by President Biden 3/11/2021
- \$1.9 trillion in relief to address the continued impact of the COVID-19 pandemic
- \$5B appropriated to address the need for homeless assistance and supportive services
- Administered through HUD's HOME Investment Partnerships Program (HOME)
- Must primarily benefit individuals and families who are homeless, at risk of homelessness or in other vulnerable populations
- Activities may include:
 - Development and Support of Affordable Housing
 - Tenant-Based Rental Assistance
 - Provision of Support Services
 - Acquisition and Development of Non-Congregate Shelter Units

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Qualifying Populations (QP)

- **Homeless**
 - As defined in section 103(a) of the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act U.S.C. 11302(a);
- **At-risk of homelessness**
 - As defined in section 401(1) of the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 11360(1));
- **Fleeing, or attempting to flee, domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, stalking, or human trafficking**, as defined by the Secretary;
- In **other populations** where providing supportive services or assistance under section 212(a) of the Act (42 U.S.C. 12742(a)) would **prevent the family's homelessness or would serve those with the greatest risk of housing instability**;
- **Veterans and families**
 - that include a veteran family member that meet one of the preceding criteria.

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Funding Allocations:

- **\$14,773,850**-Clark County Consortium HUD funding allocation
 - County Portion is \$11,671,341
 - North Las Vegas Portion is \$3,102,509
- City of Las Vegas and Henderson received direct HOME-ARP allocations from HUD; \$8,289,072 and \$2,523,480 respectively
- **Clark County Consortium-Proposed Allocation:**

• Supportive Services (25%):	\$3,693,463
• Affordable Housing Development (60%)	\$8,864,310
• Administration & Planning (15%)	<u>\$2,216,077</u>
	\$14,773,850
- **Allocation Plan due to HUD 3/31/2023**

- 2/9/2023: Draft Allocation Plan - CoC Board Meeting presentation
- 2/23/2023: Draft Allocation Plan – Posted in LVRJ & El Tiempo for 15-day public comment period
- 3/7/2023: Draft Allocation Plan & Substantial Amendment (2021 Action Plan) for HUD- Public Hearing at BCC Meeting
- 3/10/2023: Draft Allocation Plan & Substantial Amendment (2021 Action Plan) for HUD - Public Comment period closed. Incorporate public comments into Allocation Plan
- 3/21/2023: Final Allocation Plan & Substantial Amendment - BCC approval to submit both to HUD
- 3/23/2023: Submission to HUD for Review and Approval: Final Allocation Plan and the 2021 Action Plan Substantial Amendment
