Accomplishments - Action Items Completed:

- CESWG decision making process.
 - The group discussed the decision-making process for items regarding coordinated Entry.
 - One representative from each agency/organization will cast a vote on a decision-making item.
- Purpose of CESWG moving forward and potential name change
 - The group discussed bringing on a lead entity that would be responsible for monitoring the Coordinated Entry System.
 - HUD TA and the Live X team shared with the group proposed recommended changes for CESWG.
 - Draft proposal Coordinated Services Committee: Working group that supports the coordinated services systemwide, which is inclusive of the core components of coordinated entry and broader to include personcentered service delivery and coordination at the policy and standards level.
 - The CSC plays a continuous improvement and monitoring role, frequently reviewing data (qualitative and quantitative), and provides policy level oversight to the Coordinated Entry (CE) System until a CE lead entity is implemented.
 - Focus areas for the CSC related to service coordination align with System Tracker Issues and priorities. Responsibilities: -Access site training, coordination, and evaluation -Community queue management -Equitable outcomes for access, assessment, prioritization, and referral -Case conferencing for rapid housing placement -Provider training and coordination -Support CE and CE lead monitoring and evaluation.
 - The group voted to accept these recommendations and move them to the vote for approval.

 - The group will continue the discussion regarding the restructuring of Coordinated Entry.

 - Consistency/Training
 - o Current Living Situation Update in Clarity with each encounter (data element 4.12)
 - Addition of households that are sheltered affecting the data
 - o Challenges with those in sober living in determining whether they are still experiencing homelessness
 - o Garner information from client to determine intention with remaining at a sober living
 - Work with sober livings in the community who are housing those experience homelessness to better determine length of stay
 - Can affect referrals or pauses on the queue and what housing someone may be eligible after 90 days
- Written Standards for Encampment
 - Extension of the comment period based upon concerns during the September Board Meeting
 - Will likely request approval in November.
- Case Conferencing
 - Case conferencing may slow down if there are no changes in the available housing inventory
