- The first meeting of the month features Housing Problem (HPS) discussions.
- Case conferencing is targeted towards single adults and families.
- Since its inception the group has made 8 referrals to programs that support families.

- Number of housing placements (and/or PH exits).
- Number of placements off top 20 list (broken down by list).
- Number of CE assessments by agency.
- Number of referrals (status accepted, denied, pending?) avg days status change/agency response after referral
 avg days from referral to placement avg days from assessment to placement.
- Number of street outreach exits by destination.
- Group will track the progress of above.

- Unsheltered Case Conferencing meeting 1st Wednesdays at 1:00 pm at HELP of Southern Nevada
- Meet more often during the CO meetings if there is more of a flow of units available.

• Updates from the Veterans Administration

- Veteran Outreach Response Team is restarting
- Coordinated Veteran outreach response floater phone--can verify Veteran status on the spot 702-596-1859
- The Salvation Army, U.S. VETS, VA will respond within 48 hours to make contact.
- o Providers will be assigned to different days of the week to the floater phone.
- o Could get screened for VASH.
- Outreach coordinator with VA onboarding November 6th
- Progressive engagement, peer support, getting out to the shelters.
- o Liz Jarman can be contacted for case-by-case situations and have her team respond accordingly.
- o Reminder that VA CRRC is the coordinated entry hub for Veterans opening at 6:30 am.
- o 80% beds are transitional shared living dormitory with 4 to a room.
- Others may get referred to VASH for PSH
- o Go out with CPLC every Thursday—can match with HOSN team.
- Can send to Strip outreach on Thursdays.
- Sunset Park another hot spot

Unsheltered Veteran Case Conferencing

- By Name List (BNL) Progressive Engagement
- Literally homeless veterans that are checking into services
- Part A of list have been identified going to work with them to assign to case manager for weekly contacts.
- o Part B in a program already
- Will case conference beginning in November.
- Mobile medical unit will be up and running 5-days per week, December 22nd arrival.



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Homeless Census Unsheltered Count: January 25th

- Survey being updated and prepared for testing.
- o All jurisdictions will cover their own geography, including tunnels and washes.
- o Relying on outreach teams, jurisdictional staff, and agency staff to assist
- o Pre-Engagement
- Consistency/Training
- o Current Living Situation Update in Clarity with each encounter (data element 4.12)
- o Addition of households that are sheltered affecting the data.
