# **Accomplishments - Action Items Completed:**

## • Emergency Housing Vouchers

- o 525 leased 82 vouchers (89.59 % utilization rate)
- o Reviewed the number of clients that have received vouchers and are working on leasing up.
- o Followed up on the number of people that have not renewed their voucher since July and discussed resolutions that are being offered to clients who had started eligibility process but did not receive a voucher prior to 9/30.

## Mainstream Housing Vouchers

- o 268 leased 30 vouchers (89.93 % utilization rate)

- Discussed current processes that have not notified case managers on the status of briefing date or times.
- Referrals for the Mainstream program will continue with the addition of a waitlist and monthly update by Brenda through Smartsheet.
