


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Average Length of Stay and Rate of Returns to Homelessness



## Average Length of Stay




Compare the *Average Length of Stay* with other *Performance Measures* (Example: positive exits)

Personal identifying Information (PII) (i.e. name, date of birth, social security #)



From 2021 to 2024 56% increase






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
### Impact and Outcome

Average Length of Stay




According to HUD, a CoC is "a community plan to organize and deliver housing and services to meet the specific needs of people who are homeless as they move to stable housing and maximize self-sufficiency. It includes action steps to end homelessness and prevent a return to homelessness."

#### 10 Year Homelessness Count


From 2021 to 2024 56% increase






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### Sheltered and Unsheltered Overall PIT Count 2014-2024



### 2024 Sheltered and Unsheltered Age Groups




## 2024 Sheltered and Unsheltered by Gender

Sheltered and Unsheltered by Race Category


Black, African American, or African account for 42% of the population

Compare the *Average Length of Stay* among *Race* or *Rate of Return* among *Race* 











## Service Providers and Project Types

Permanent Supportive Housing	11
Rapid Re-Housing	40
Transitional Housing	25
Grand Total	130

# Summary

- Based on current trends, homelessness in Clark County has increased by 56% since 2021
- The number of people experiencing homelessness who don't have shelter increased by 50% in 2021.
- The number of people experiencing homelessness with shelter increased by 40% from 2023 to 2024.
  - The percentage of people experiencing homelessness aged 35 to 44 is 22%.
    - 60% of the homeless population in Clark County identify as male.
  - 42% of Clark County's homeless population identifies as Black, African American, or African
    - Emergency housing accounts for 38% of all project types.
