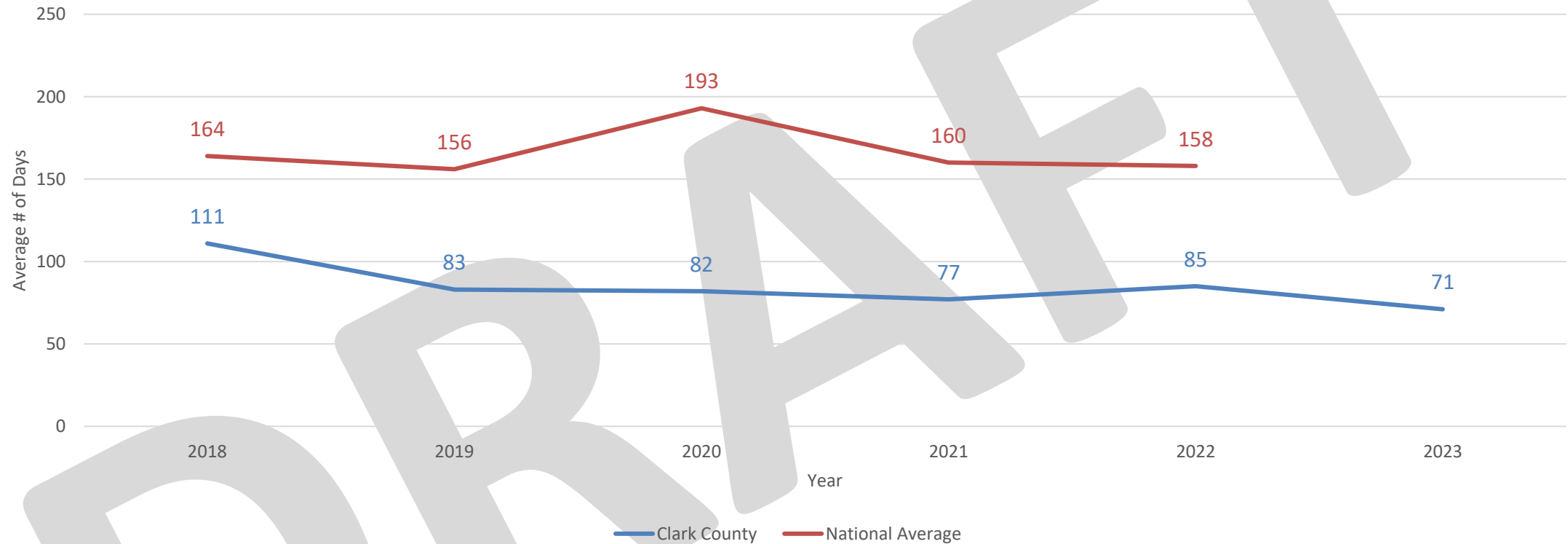

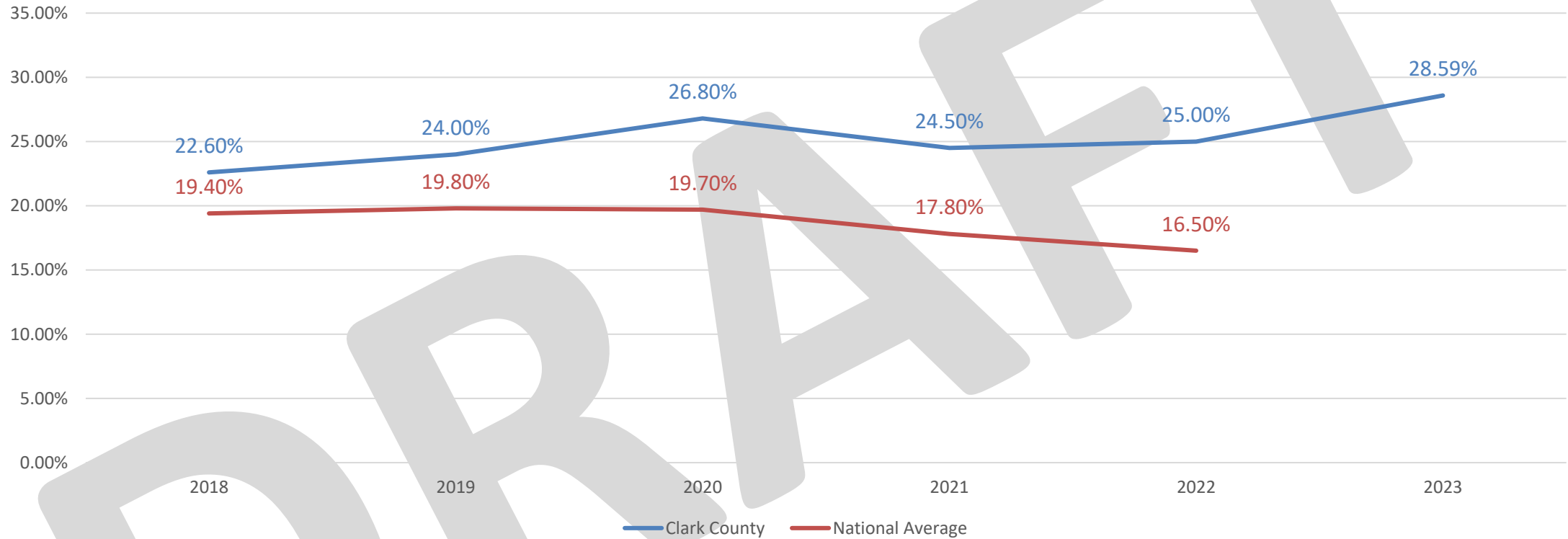

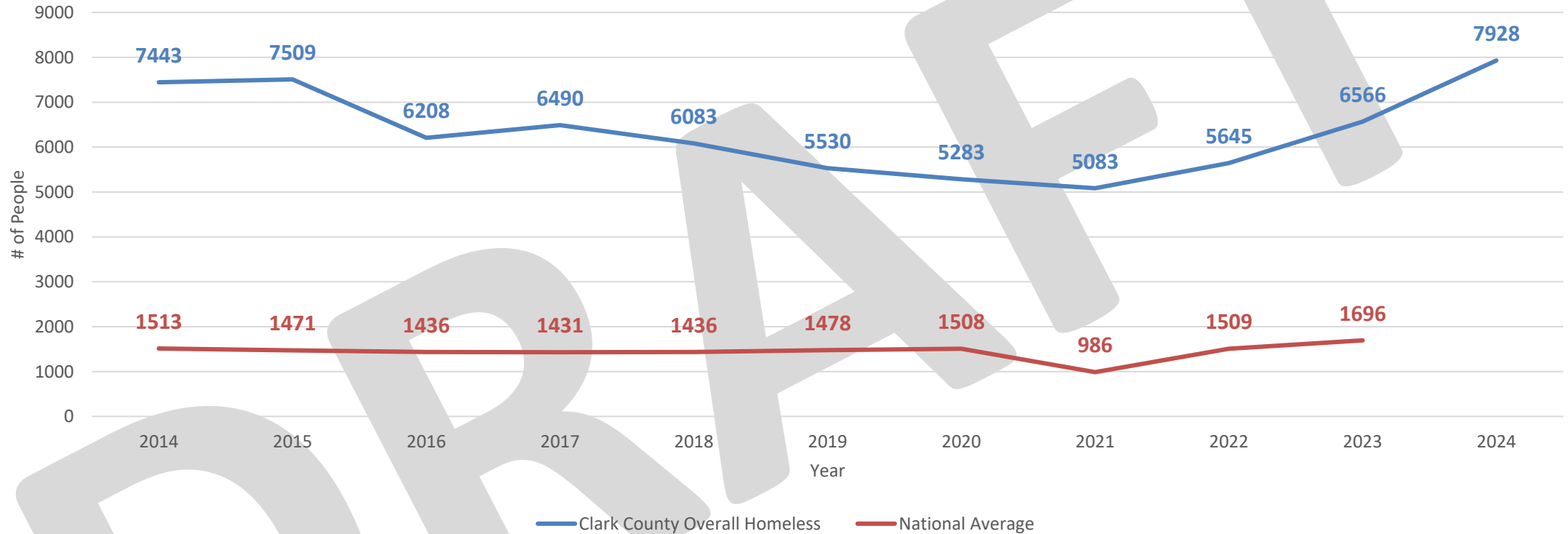
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10 Year Homelessness Count

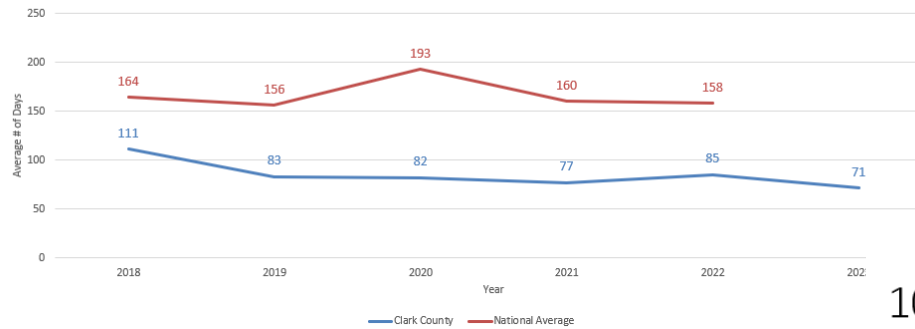
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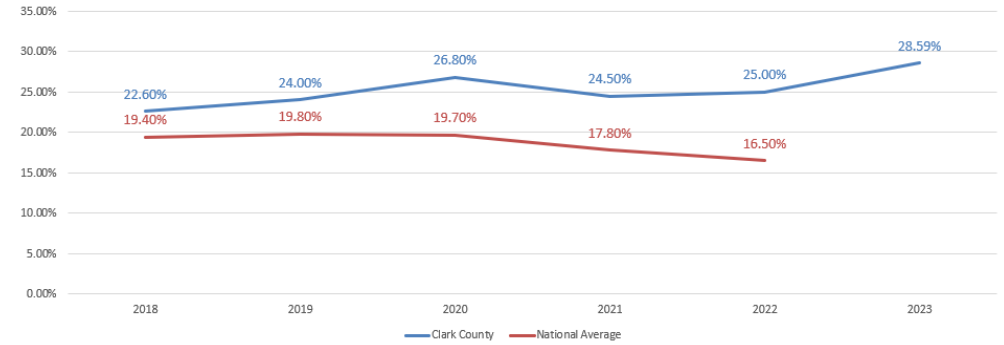

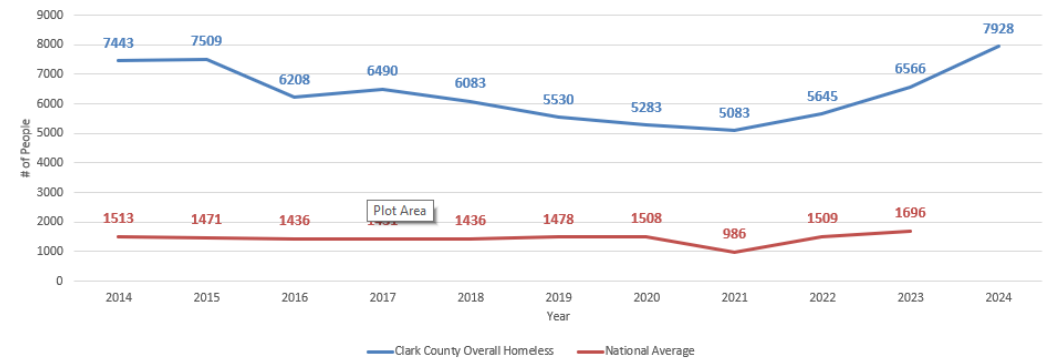


Rate of Returns to Homelessness in 24 months Rate



According to HUD, a CoC is “a community plan to organize and deliver housing and services to meet the specific needs of people who are homeless as they move to stable housing and maximize self-sufficiency. It includes action steps to end homelessness and prevent a return to homelessness.”

10 Year Homelessness Count

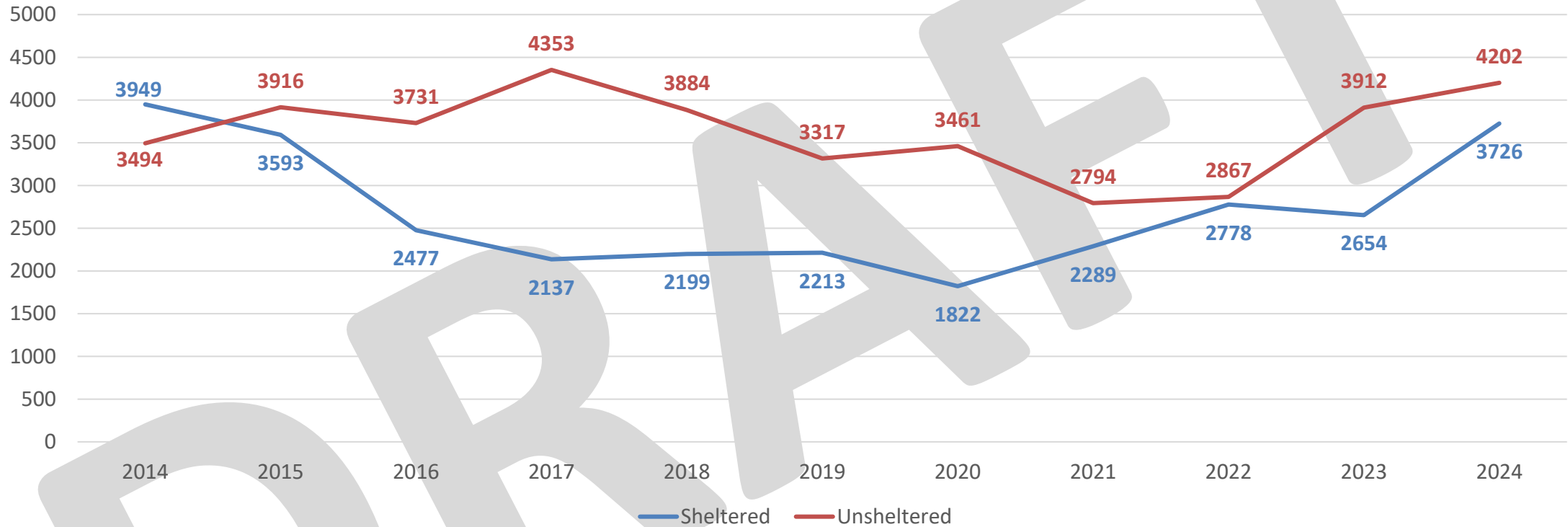


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Sheltered and Unsheltered Overall PIT Count 2014-2024

50% increase

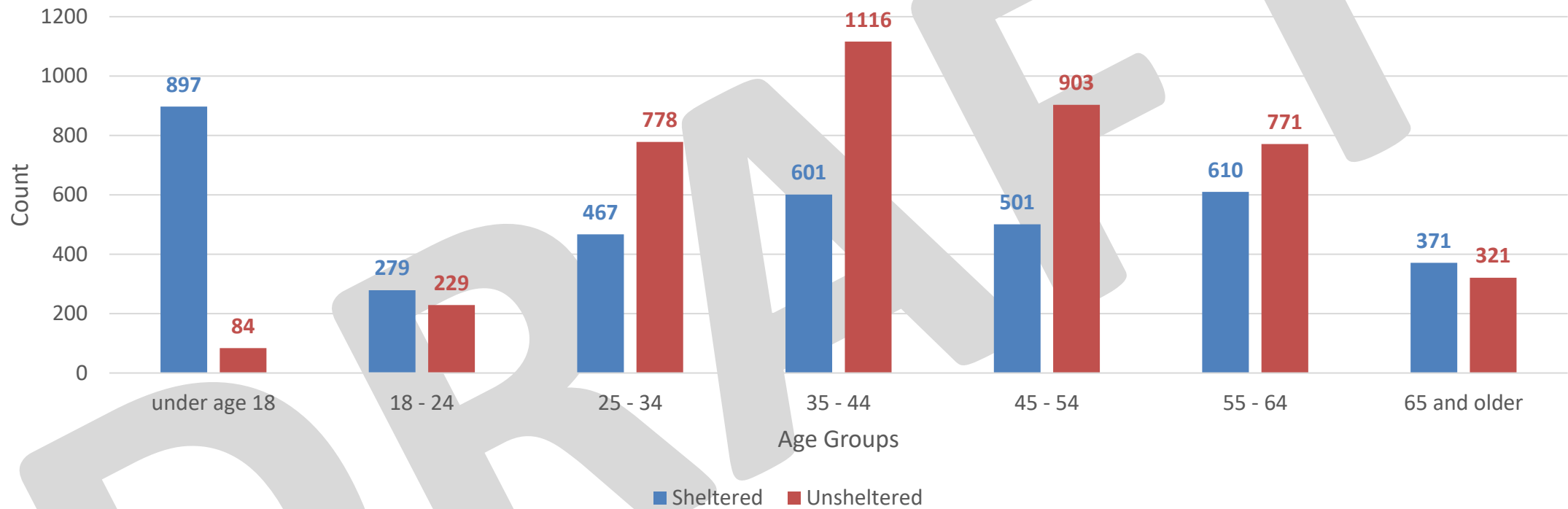


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2024 Sheltered and Unsheltered Age Groups



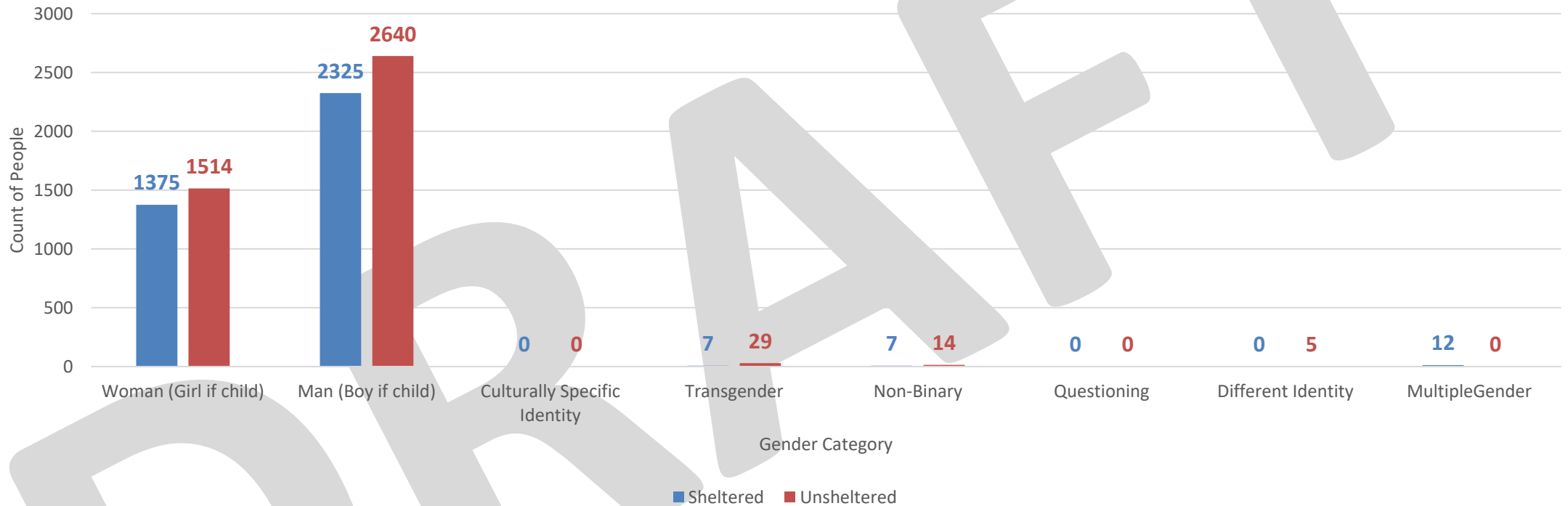
Ages 35-44 account for 22% of the population

Males account for 60% of the population



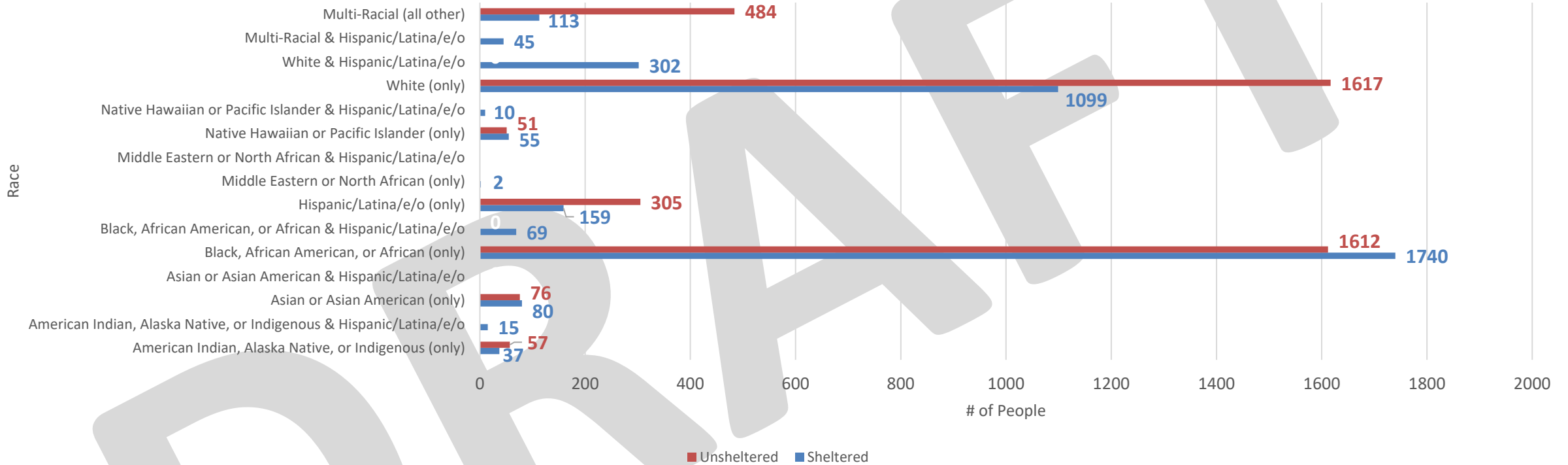
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2024 Sheltered and Unsheltered by Race

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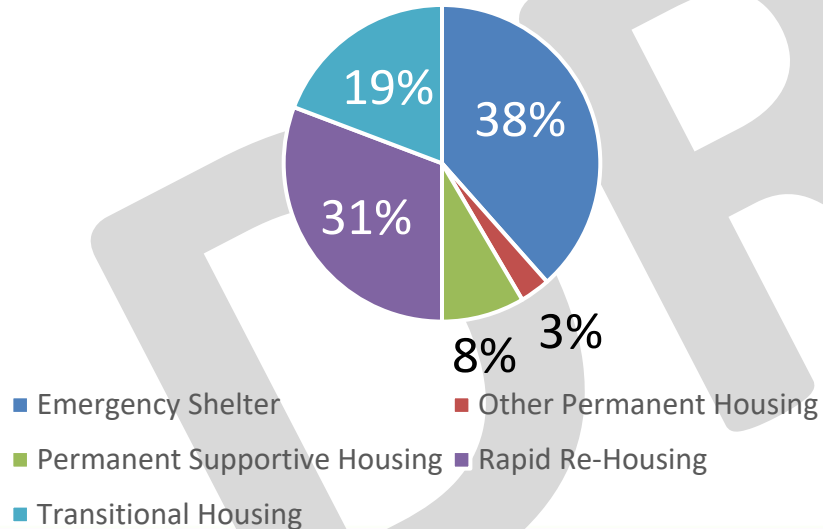

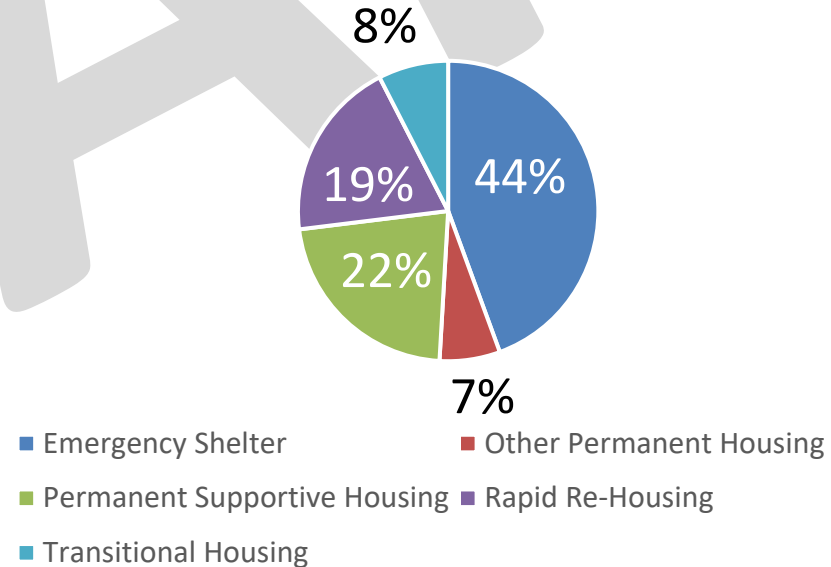

Summary

- Based on current trends, homelessness in Clark County has increased by 56% since 2021
- The number of people experiencing homelessness who don't have shelter increased by 50% in 2021.
- The number of people experiencing homelessness with shelter increased by 40% from 2023 to 2024.
 - The percentage of people experiencing homelessness aged 35 to 44 is 22%.
 - 60% of the homeless population in Clark County identify as male.
 - 42% of Clark County's homeless population identifies as Black, African American, or African
 - Emergency housing accounts for 38% of all project types.
