Lisa Corrado was appointed Assistant City Manager for the City of Henderson in September 2024, bringing nearly two decades of experience in public service, regional planning, and community development. Known for her leadership in land use, behavioral health, homelessness response, and substance use prevention, she has helped secure millions in federal and state funding to support public health and neighborhood revitalization. Since joining Henderson in 2006, Lisa has led departments including Planning, Building and Fire Safety, and Neighborhood Services. She spearheaded initiatives such as the "Don't Risk It All With Fentanyl" campaign, Fentanyl Awareness Summits, and co-authored a DOJ grant to launch a Mobile Crisis Intervention Team aligned with the 988 system. Her work has shaped policies on homelessness and expanded the city's social service capacity.

Fluent in Spanish and Portuguese, Lisa holds degrees in Hispanic Languages & Literature and Political Science, a Master of Public Administration from the University of Pittsburgh, and a Professional Certificate in Personal Leadership from Stanford University.
