The table below summarizes the proposed methodology for calculating each of the performance measures for the 2025 Monitoring process. These are mostly the same as the calculations used in the 2024 NOFO process, with some minor adjustments developed based on provider input. Target percentages have been reset to align with actual performance in CY 2023 and CY 2024. To garner full points on any given measure, projects must have above-average performance.
