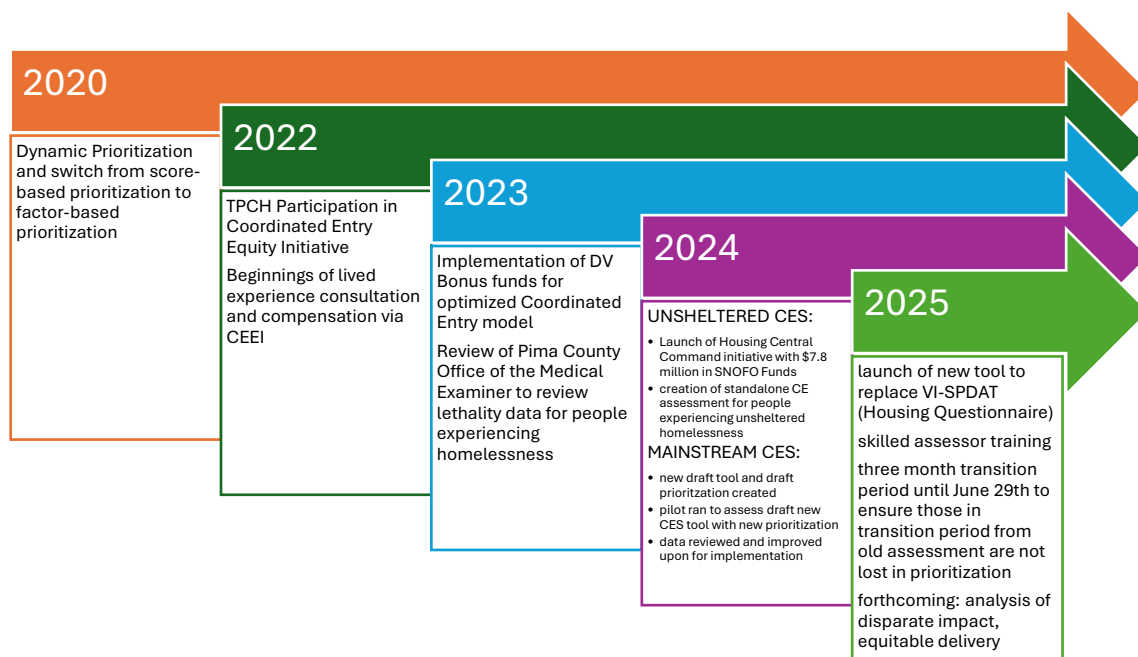
Implementation of New Assessment Tools, Prioritization Schema, and Process Changes



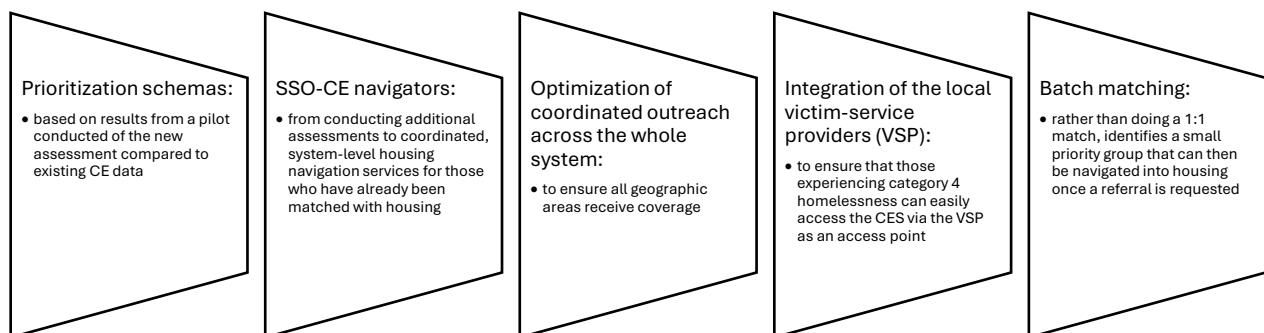
Background:

Beginning in July of 2023, the Coordinated Entry Committee and other key partners began work to develop a new assessment tool to replace the VI-SPDAT (Vulnerability Index Service Prioritization Decision Assistance Tool) family of tools. The new tool intends to serve people more equitably and accessibly through the Coordinated Entry System, and shifts prioritization based on data gathered on mortality from the Pima County Office of the Medical Examiner.

In addition to the development of a new tool, several other system changes have been implemented to optimize the Coordinated Entry System. Some of these changes were brought about by peripheral initiatives, such as the acquisition of DV Bonus Funding for Coordinated Entry and the TPCH Unsheltered Initiative funded by the acquisition of Supplemental Funds to address unsheltered homelessness.

Assessment Outcomes:

With the help of our local university as well as technical assistance, we have utilized several tools and data sources to determine the impact of these changes to the assessment tools on disparate groups.

University of Arizona Southwest Institute for Research on Women: Developing a New Coordinated Entry Tool & Prioritization Approach

Summary of SIROW Recommendations

Development:

The group used data to drive their prioritization schema, letting the data they gathered drive how the prioritization should be shifted. They looked at the way different groups answered questions. The overall goal was to decrease mortality, so they focused on substance use since that was the highest cause of death according to the Pima County Office of the Medical Examiner.

The below operationalizations demonstrate how the prioritization works: the more factors someone has, the more vulnerable they are. Some of the takeaways from their equity analysis include:

- Non-males (including those who are female identified, trans, and non-binary) were being underprioritized because of one of the system involvement questions. To achieve parity, they changed this question to be merged within a separate domestic violence factor.

Recommended Edits to Existing Proposed Tools

**DV Question

-Ed Sakwa of the Emerge Center based on recommendations from a risk assessment expert that it would be ideal to have this question “Has there been physical abuse in the relationship you are fleeing/attempting to flee?” **instead of** the question in the tables above (which is drawn from the VI-SPDAT). This means that this revision to the current proposed tools.

Question Order

Starting the new assessment with questions about substance use may set a negative tone or raise concerns about stigma related to substance use. To avoid the potential for social desirability bias distorting client responses, we recommend that these questions be moved further down into the survey. This is another revision to the current proposed tools.

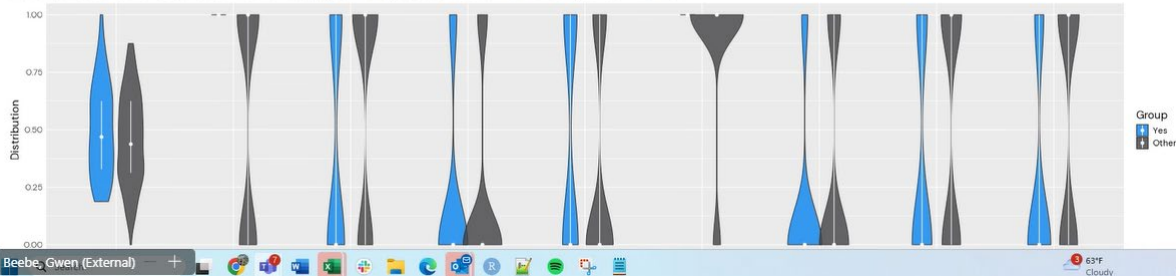

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This data demonstrates that folks who are trans (top row) are almost twice as likely to be fleeing as all other groups.

Hispanic: less likely to report experiencing discrimination, more likely to have physical disability

- More likely to report a multigenerational household
- More likely to be coming from a system of care
- Significantly more likely to be fleeing domestic violence
