

Good afternoon,

As you are probably aware, a recent federal court order has required HUD to withdraw the FY 2025 NOFO and re-issue the FY 2024-2025 NOFO that was originally released in July 2024. On January 9, 2026, HUD reissued the FY 2024-2025 NOFO in its original form, without changes to the language. Through these communications, HUD has indicated that funding will be available only for renewal of existing grants and for new projects created through re-allocation of existing projects.

Now that HUD is operating under the terms of the FY 2024-2025 NOFO, the requirements relating to allowable new projects have changed. The only eligible new project types are Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH), Rapid Rehousing (RRH), Joint Transitional Housing/Rapid Rehousing (TH-RRH) and Coordinated Entry (CE-SSO). This means that new Transitional Housing and new Supportive Services Only (SSO) projects are not allowed. This applies to projects submitting for re-allocated funding and to transition grants.

Since we are now operating under the terms of the FY 2024-2025 NOFO, **local applications submitted to CCSS by the December 18, 2025 local deadline no longer apply at this time.**

Thank you for taking the time to prepare and submit a local application to CCSS. We appreciate the effort and resources that go into these submissions. We expect HUD to issue a new NOFO for FY 2026 sometime this summer, and it is likely to be similar to the FY 2025 NOFO which will align with your applications and HUD's new applicable priorities. Organizations interested in applying for funding for TH or SSO projects (including transition grants) should consider submitting applications in the 2026 funding competition.
